People are optimistic that govt. will resolve their problems. The overall perception about functioning of govt. was found good.

There was an overwhelming response of people during the visit. However a resentment among the people was also noted. People were resentful about the follow up of back to village 1 as many

	The response to B2V3 was found to be lukewarm among the local population. People were found to be disappointed with the follow up action on demands raised during B2V and B2V2. Those who came forward to participate in B2V3 activities demanded that concrete steps should be taken to redress the grievances of the local people. It is hoped that urgent and much needed demands like the link road and shortage of staff in schools and health sub centre are addressed well in time.
