- vii. The officer shall participate in the Gram Sabha and also ask the Gram Panchayat to constitute Social Audit Committee incase the same has not been constituted earlier.
- viii. He/She shall also hold interactions with prominent citizens, frontline government functionaries, NGOs/ social organization, respectables of the area and the general public.
- ix. He/She shall also visit schools, health institutions besides important village assets/ amenities related to various sectors.
- x. The visiting officer shall inspect major languishing projects, inaugurate playgrounds (if any), participate in exhibition melas, distribution of certificates, etc.
- xi. The officer shall during all his interactions emphasize on education, nutrition and health of children, empowerment of women, general cleanliness, solid waste management, organic farming, vermi-composting, rain water harvesting and water conservation.
