- iv. The officer shall during all his interactions emphasize on education, nutrition and health of children, empowerment of women, gender blindness, solid waste management, organic farming, vermiculture, rain water harvesting and water conservation.
- v. The visiting officer shall assess the ground situation of selected Panchayat vis-à-vis perceptions of local public. Data provided by different Departments, inputs shared by the PUC/ prominent officers and his own observations.
- vi. Any conclusions drawn shall include a realistic view point of the general public. Efforts shall be made to bring out general highlights of the area based on contents.
- vii. The visiting officer shall refrain himself/ herself from giving or offering any commitment on behalf of the government.
- viii. The visiting officer shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues.
- ix. The report of the visiting officer shall be submitted both physically and electronically in the pre-specified format. The officer shall exercise utmost care and objectivity while filling up the relevant form.
