

General Instructions for the Visiting Officer

- i. A Suggested Activity Schedule has been prepared for the visiting officer. It shall be intimated on the office to ensure that all activities and documents mentioned in the schedule are carried out / covered fully.
- ii. The officer shall participate in the Gram Sabha, discuss the contents of Gram Panchayat Development Plan and also join the Gram Panchayat in constitute Social Audit Committee in case the same have not been constituted earlier.
- iii. He/She shall also hold interactions with relevant officers, functionaries, government functionaries, NGOs/ IBOs/ organization, respectable citizens of the area and the general public.
- iv. He/She shall also visit schools, health institutions besides important village assets which are related to various sectors.
- v. The visiting officer shall, if required by existing projects, manage arrangements if and participate in exhibition stalls, distribution of certificates, etc.
- vi. The officer shall during visits interact with regard to education, nutrition and health of children, empolacement of women, general cleanliness, solar water management, organic farming, waste management, rain water harvesting and water conservation.
- vii. The visiting officer shall review the growth/ status of various Panchayat areas via perception of local public, data provided by different Departments, results shared by the Panchayat Samiti and his own observations.
- viii. Any conclusions drawn shall include a holistic view/ audit of the Gram Panchayat. Effort shall be made to bring out general highlights of the area based on consensus.
- ix. The visiting officer shall restrain himself from giving or making any commitment on behalf of the Government.
- x. The visiting officer shall address certain queries attributable to relevant issues.
- xi. The report of the visiting officer shall be submitted both physically and electronically in the pre-specified format. The officer shall ensure all care and objectivity while filling up the relevant form.
