- xii. Any conclusions drawn shall include a holistic view point of the general public. Efforts shall be made to bring out general highlights of the area based on consensus.
- xiii. The visiting officer shall restrain himself/ herself from giving or offering any commitment on behalf of the government.
- xiv. The visiting officer shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues.
