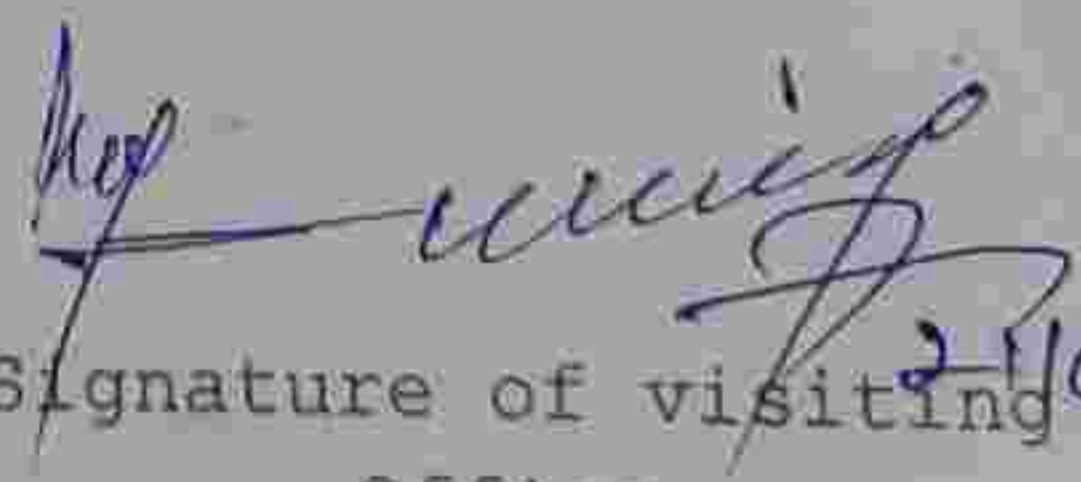
Sub: "Back to village" programme and submission of

1. As the main economy of the GP (village) is based on Horticulture and allied departments. But due to unaccessibility of population to

the horticulture zone presently located at Rajpora for the convene of department. So creation of Horticulture at village Abhama (centre location for the area) and upgradation of Agriculture circle upto the level of agriculture zone.

2. All the Educational institution operating in the village, with high enrollment are without accommodation and required staff and playgrounds.

3. Due to the poorest infrastructure of PDD (with old, damaged, outdated electric poles and cables, trees being used for supporting HT/LT lines is the biggest hindrance which leads to the shortage of electricity in the village.

4. Health sector is almost neglected, population is without medical facilities for last 15 years. As in the past AD in the village was having residential doctor available for 24 hours.

5. Due to the prominent and peculiar and beautiful topography of the village Abhama, it may be developed and upgraded as the smart village.

6. Being a largest revenue village, Constitution / creation of Patwar Halga and Giridawar circle is need and demand of the population. Construction of building for Patwar Khana having its own land in the village.
