Mission Statement

In a first of its kind, the Government of Jammu and Kashmir has embarked on an ambitious and extensive programme of reaching out to the people at the grassroots level to create in the rural masses an earnest desire for decent standard of living.

The 'Back to Village' programme is aimed to involve the people of the state and government officials in a joint effort to deliver the mission of equitable development. The programme is aimed at energizing Panchayats and directing development efforts in rural areas through community participation.

As part of this programme, civil servants will have to reach out to each Panchayat of the State, where they will stay for a specific period to interact and obtain feedback from the grassroots so as to tailor government efforts in improving delivery of village-specific services.

The 'Back to Village' programme has been conceived with the objective of ensuring that developmental initiatives are built on the feedback and cooperation of the people, thus being more results oriented with greater probability of success than those which are top-down.

The programme revolves around the concept that while the official machinery has to guide and assist, the primary responsibility to improve local conditions rests with the people themselves. Therefore, they must be encouraged to own a programme so that benefits are maximised.

The life of a person living in a rural area is not cut into segments in the way the Government activities are prone to be. The approach at the village level, therefore, has to be a coordinated, touching all aspects of village life. Such an approach has to be made, not through a multiplicity of departmental officials, but through Panchayats.

The essence of the 'Back to Village' programme is to emphasize the importance of ensuring, right from the beginning, people's participation, not merely as an agent in the execution of the development works but as owners of the entire programme.

We hope this initiative will go a long way in achieving long term objective of grassroots democracy.

General Instructions for the Visiting Officer

- i. A suggested Activity Schedule will be provided to the visiting officer to plan his excursions on the State. He is not to deviate and complete his work in the schedule as far as possible.
- ii. The officer shall participate in the Gram Sabha around the concept of Gram Panchayat Development Plan and also in the Gram Panchayat 15 Yearly Social Audit Committee in case the Gram Panchayat has been constituted since.
- iii. He/she shall hold discussions with prominent persons, village government functionaries, KUDU/Local organizer, village-level officers of the field and the general public.
- iv. He/she shall also visit schools, health institutions, teacher training camps and/or amenities related to rural sector.
- v. The visiting officer shall visit major irrigation projects, major water resources if any, participate in extension programmes of various departments, etc.
- vi. The officer shall during all his interactions emphasize on rural health and health of children, employment of women, general education, land usage management, organic farming, semi-cooperatives, etc. also visiting and water conservation.
- vii. The visiting officer shall assess the ground situation of various Panchayats in terms of the perception of local public data provided by District Departments, results shared by the PDR/ prominent citizens and his own observations.
- viii. Any conclusions drawn shall include a holistic view about the general public. Efforts shall be made to bring out general highlights of the area based on consensus.
- ix. The visiting officer shall maintain thorough record from visiting or during any conversation on behalf of the government.
- x. The visiting officer shall accept an unbiased attitude in reporting status.
- xi. The report of the visiting officer shall be submitted both physically and electronically in the pre-circulated format. The officer shall exercise all care and objectively write things up the relevant items.
