

### **Mission Statement**

In a first of its kind, the Government of Jammu and Kashmir has embarked on an ambitious and effective programme of reaching out to the rural masses. This programme is aimed at instilling an earnest desire for decent standard of living.

The Back to Village programme is aimed to involve the people of the State and government officials in a joint effort to deliver the mission of rural development. The programme is being carried out at the Panchayat and directing development efforts in rural areas through Gram Sabhas.

As part of this programme, civil servants will have to march out to each Panchayat of the State, where they will stay for a specific period to interact and obtain feedback from the grassroots sections of society, and in improving delivery of various specific services.

The Back to Village programme has been conceived with the objective of ensuring that developmental initiatives are built on the strength of local resources. It has been designed to be more and more anchored with greater probability of success than those which are top down.

The programme revolves around the concept that since the official machinery has to guide and assist, the primary responsibility to improve local conditions rests with the people themselves. Therefore, they must be encouraged to own a programme so that benefits are maximized.

The life of a person living in a rural area is not cut into segments in the way the Government acts. It is a part of his life. Hence, an all out effort is required, and therefore, has to be a coordinated, touching all aspects of village life. Such an approach has to be adopted, not through a multiplicity of departments, but through Panchayats.

The essence of the Back to Village programme is to emphasize the importance of ensuring right from the beginning, peoples participation, not merely as an input in the execution of the developmental tasks, but as a core of the entire programme.

We hope this initiative will go a long way in achieving long term objective of grassroots democracy.

### **General Instructions for the Visiting Officer**

1. A suggested Activity Schedule has been prepared for the visiting officer to guide him in his work. He is advised to follow the schedule and make necessary modifications in it to suit his needs and environment completely.
2. The officer shall participate in the Gram Sabha. Besides the work of Gram Panchayat Development, he shall also take up Gram Sabha to coordinate with Gram Sabha Chairman and other members of the Gram Sabha.
3. He shall also keep interaction with permanent citizens, Non-governmental organizations, NGOs, local social organization, representative bodies of the area and the government public.
4. He shall also visit schools, health institutions, temples, madrasas, village estates, shrine related to various sects.
5. The visiting officer shall not make languishing visits. He should spend time of any duration in interaction with the concerned people.
6. The visiting officer shall pay attention to the problems of agriculture, nutrition and health of the people during his interaction with the people. He should also make arrangements for some lectures, seminars, workshops, etc. for better networking and value communication.
7. The visiting officer shall keep the ground situation of selected Panchayat, village, panchayat of local cluster, etc. updated by different Departments, including by the Panchayat, Gram Sabha Chairman and the concerned people.
8. Any contentious issues shall include a healthy view point of the concerned public. Efforts shall be made to bring out general consensus of the area based on common sense.
9. The visiting officer shall receive formally issued documents or offering any commitment on behalf of the government.
10. The visiting officer shall adopt an unbiased attitude in interacting with people.
11. The report of the visiting officer shall be submitted both physically and electronically in the pre-specified format. The officer shall exercise all care and objectivity while filling up the required form.




### MEMORANDUM
