

Mission Statement

In a first of its kind, the Government of JAWAHAR LALOKHUMA has
initiated an ambitious and extensive programme of reaching
out to the people at the grassroots level by a road in the rural areas
so as to bring about a radical transformation.

The 'Back to Village' programme is aimed to involve the people of the
state and government officials in a joint effort. However the ultimate
goal is equitable development. The programme is aimed at ensuring
of equitable development efforts, natural assets through
participation and resulting development efforts, natural assets through
community participation.

As part of this programme, civil servants will have to reach out to
each Panchayat in the state, where they will be expected to spend a period
in contact and obtain feedback from the grassroots so as to tailor
the efforts in providing a variety of village specific services,
government efforts in improving delivery of village specific services.

The Back to Village programme has been conceived with the
objective of ensuring that development initiatives are built on the
feedback and suggestion of the people, thus being more result
oriented with greater probability of success than those which are top
down.

The programme revolves around the concept that while the official
machinery has to guide and assist, the primary responsibility of
improving conditions rests with the people themselves. Therefore,
they must be encouraged to own a programme so that benefits are
maximized.

The life of a person living in a rural area is not cut into segments
in the way the Government activities are prone to do. The approach
at the village level, therefore, has to be a coordinated, touching all
aspects of village life. Such an approach has to be made, not through
a multitude of departmental officials but through Panchayats.

The essence of the 'Back to Village' programme is to emphasize
the importance of ensuring, right from the beginning, people's
participation, not merely as an effort in the execution of the
development works but as owners of the entire programme.

We hope this initiative will go a long way in achieving long term
objectives of grassroots democracy.

General Instructions for the Visiting Officer

- i. A visiting officer may take up the visitation assignment in the visiting order issued by the Commissioner or the officer in charge of the concerned department mentioned in the concerned letter and carried out fully.
- ii. The officer shall participate in the Gram Sabha meeting, the concept of Gram Panchayat, State Council Plan and also take the Gram Panchayat to constitute Gram Panchayat Committee if same has not been constituted so far.
- iii. He/She shall be entitled to interact with people and citizens from the concerned Gram Sabha, Block/Local Organization, especially citizens of the area and the general public.
- iv. He/She shall also visit schools, health institutions,anganwadi, Upazila/Village, anganwadi committee related to various sectors.
- v. The visiting officer shall visit most important projects like organic agriculture, Fair price shop in order to know about distribution of certificates, etc.
- vi. The officer shall during such interaction emphasize on education, rural life and the health of children, empowerment of women, gender, nutrition, solid waste management, organic farming, rain water harvesting and women's empowerment.
- vii. The visiting officer shall assess the ground situation of Akshara Panchayat vis-a-vis perception of local public, data provided by different Departments made available by the FPO/ concerned villages and its own observations.
- viii. Any conclusions drawn shall include a holistic view and of the general public. Efforts shall be made to bring out general highlights of the area based on experience.
- ix. The visiting officer shall take an unbiased approach in reporting results.
- x. The report of the visiting officer shall be submitted both manually and electronically in the pre-circulated format. The officer shall exercise objectivity and objectivity while filling up the relevant form.


