Back to Village

In a first of its kind the Government of Jammu and Kashmir has embarked on an ambitious and extensive programme of reaching out to the people at the grassroots level to create in the rural masses an earnest desire for decent standard of living.

The 'Back to village' programme is aimed to involve the people of the state and government officials in a joint effort to deliver the mission of equitable development. The programme is aimed at energizing Panchayats and directing development efforts in rural areas through community participation.

Under this programme, civil servants will have to reach out to each Panchayat of the state where they will stay for a specific period to interact and obtain feedback from the people. It is so as to tailor government efforts in improving delivery of village-specific services.

The 'Back to Village' programme has been conceived with the objective of ensuring that developmental initiatives are built on the feedback and cooperation of the people. Thus the outcome will be result oriented with greater probability of success than those which are top down.

The core of the programme revolves around the concept that while the official machinery has to guide, it cannot be denied that the primary responsibility to improve local conditions rests with the people themselves. Therefore, they must be encouraged to own a programme so that ownership is maximized.

This approach of life or living in a rural area is not cut into segments in the way the Government officials are prone to be. The approach at the village level, therefore, has to be integrated, touching all aspects of village life. Such an approach has to be implemented not through a multiplicity of departmental officials but through Panchayats.

The cornerstone of the 'Back to Village' programme is to emphasize the importance of ensuring that from the beginning, people's participation, not merely as an agent in the execution of the development works but as owners of the entire programme.

These initiatives will go a long way in achieving long term objective of grassroots development.

Guidelines for the Visiting Officer

1. A suggested Activity Schedule has been prepared for the visiting officer. It shall be incumbent on the officer to ensure that all activities and elements mentioned in the schedule are carried out/ covered fully.
2. The officer shall participate in the Gram Sabha, discuss the concept of Gram Panchayat Development Plan and also ask the Gram Panchayat to constitute such a Sicut Committee in case the same has not been constituted earlier.
3. He/She shall also hold interactions with prominent citizens, frontline government functionaries, NGOs/ social organization, respectable citizens of the area and the general public.
4. The officer shall also visit schools, health institutions, besides important village amenities related to various sectors.
5. The visiting officer shall visit major languishing projects, inaugurate playgrounds and participate in exhibition melas, distribution of certificates, etc.
6. The officer shall during all his interactions emphasize on education, nutrition and health of children, empowerment of women, general cleanliness, solid waste management, organic farming, vermi-composting, rain water harvesting and other conservation.
7. The visiting officer shall assess the ground situation of allotted Panchayat vis-à-vis perception of local public, data provided by different Departments, inputs shared by the PRI/ prominent citizens and his own observations.
8. His conclusions drawn shall include a holistic view point of the general public. Efforts shall be made to bring out general highlights of the area based on the above.
9. The visiting officer shall restrain himself/ herself from giving or offering any guarantee on behalf of the government.
10. The visiting officer shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues.
11. Report of the visiting officer shall be submitted both physically and electronically in the pre-circulated format. The officer shall exercise all care and responsibility while filling up the relevant form.
