6. Many areas are under constant threat of flood esp Khan Mohallah & Kasoral Mohallah, and Banali B wards too. Proper channels need to be made and locals agreed to provide land for new channels too.
7. Govt buildings need to be provided to rented accommodations. No rent has been provided to rented primary schools which furms the owners viz. Hafizullah Mir and Khan Sahab. Same complaint raised by ICDs centers like Banali B.
8. Most households in Banali are low income families so ration cards s/b changed to PHH from NPHH. As people don't have rice fields, so scale for rice s/b increased to 7kgs. and sugar to 1kg.
9. ICDs centers have no heating arrangements for this hilly area. Fuel is not provided also. Insufficient supply of utensils, and ration is a concern. Toilet facilities aren't available though mostly women are as staff. ICDs kids s/b provided uniform to distinguish them.
10. Special assistance is needed to few downtrodden and handicapped families like Mohd Ismail Khatana of Yrard No. 4, Syed Mir Jam Shah whose only son is ailing & himself too, Ali Rasool Sheikh and many more. Mohd Rafiq Shah whose daughter met an accident & is handicapped now needs justice.
