Additional Demands put forth by Public of the GP Ganiwan-before the visiting officer under programme "Back to Village".

Education Sector:-

1. Boys Higher Secondary School Ganiwan,

- A. The post of Principal is vacant since Nov. 2018.
- B. The school is located on roadside (NH1) but without proper fencing for major portion which badly effect the academics of the school. The animals, dogs outdoors easily venture to get inside the school which is cause of concern as a number of girl students do study in the institution. This is unhealthy for school safety.
- C. PDD department has installed 250 KV Transformer within School Premises near the front gate of the School, which is a great threat /danger to the life and property. The School Authorities have taken up the matter with the SDM Kangan vide letter No. HSS/Hgn/686/88 dated 22.12.2018 but no fruitful result came out.
- D. The Laboratory Block constructed in the year 2014 has not been handed over to Education Department.
- E. Deficiency of staff in the School.
- F. Demand for furniture for the students.
- G. The Demand for footpath, Playground and proper drainage system within the school premises.

2. Govt. Girls Middle School Hariganiwan:

- a. Demand for playground and construction of Second storey of School building.

3. Primary School Kalokailpati:

- a. A drain on eastern side of the boundary wall of the school is continuously damaging the boundary wall which is required to be constructed properly. In addition the kitchen and bathroom is without Truss .
