- Figure 1 shows the results of the regression analysis. The dependent variable is the number of days of absence from work due to illness. The independent variables are the age, sex, and education of the respondent, and the number of children in the household. The results show that the number of days of absence from work due to illness increases with age, and is higher for females than for males. Education has a negative effect on the number of days of absence from work due to illness, and the number of children in the household has a positive effect.
