x. He/She shall also visit schools, health institutions besides important village assets/ amenities related to various sectors.

t. The visiting officer shall inspect major languishing projects, inaugurate playgrounds (if any), participate in exhibition melas, distribution of certificates, etc.

xi. The officer shall during all his interactions emphasize on education, nutrition and health of children, empowerment of women, general cleanliness, solid waste management, organic farming, vermi-composting, rain water harvesting and water conservation.
