	day to day problems which get compounded due poor road connectivity basic Health services. Education & poor access to Banking services. The villagers are predominantly dependent on subsistence Agriculture & Labour for their livelihood

There is poor support from Agriculture & Horticulture Department for the development of household Industry. This is probably poor infrastructure in the Gram Panchayat. However, most of the villagers have fairly good size of land holding which is sufficient for subsistence Agriculture. As the Gram Panchayat is located along the bank of river Ravi perennial water it has a great potential for the development of adventure tourism & fishing. The soil climate and presence of perennial source of flowing water, provide the Gram Panchayat Hutt with untapped potential for Horticulture, Agriculture, Farming & Aquaculture tourism department for employment & development for the household Industry.

VII. Overall assessment of visit (Panchayat Functioning):

Regarding overall assessment of Panchayat Functioning, the undersigned has observed that Gram Panchayat meetings (Majlis) are held regularly on 7th & 25th day of every month. However, due to hectic and tough daily routine & undulating topography & tough terrain participation in these meetings is not shown encouraging. It is also observed that there is relatively lesser number of women participants in Gram Sabha meeting due to poor inter connectivity between different hamlets and they have to work even harder than the menfolk of the area. Moreover, there is urgent need for the construction of incomplete road from Shara to Hutt, road from Kasheer to Patrera, deployment of teaching staff at different Schools, deployement of Medical Officer as well as Para Medical staff at PHC Hutt. There is also diar need of services like banking/insurance/delivery of gas cylinder at Gram Panchayat.

During the Gram Sabha, the undersigned observed that there is virtually left awareness among the Gram Sabha Members about the quantum of funds earmarked for development works to be taken up under various Govt. schemes.

Since, there was Social Audit Committee constituted in the Village, the people are less aware about the role & responsibility of Social Audit Committee.
