- vi. A suggestive activity schedule has been prepared for the visiting officer. It shall be incumbent on the officer to ensure that all activities and elements mentioned in the schedule are carried out/ covered fully.
- vii. The officer shall participate in the Gram Sabha and also ask the Gram Panchayat to constitute Social Audit Committee in case the same has not been constituted earlier.
- viii. He/She shall also hold interactions with prominent citizens, frontline government functionaries, NGOs/ social organization, respectables of the area and the general public.
- ix. He/She shall also visit schools, health institutions besides important village assets/ amenities related to various sectors.
- x. The visiting officer shall inspect major languishing projects, inaugurate playgrounds (if any), participate in exhibition melas, distribution of certificates, etc.
- xi. The officer shall during all his interactions emphasize on education, nutrition and health of children, empowerment of women, general cleanliness, solid waste management, organic farming, vermi-composting, rain water harvesting and water conservation.
