We hope this initiative will go a long way in achieving our basic objective of sustainable development.

General Instructions for the Visiting Officer

A suggested activity programme has been prepared for the visiting officer. It shall be submitted on the spot to the Director of Education and Curriculum Department for examination and certified valid.

1. The visiting officer shall on the spot, during the period of inspection, inspect the following:-
 - a) The teacher-student ratio in the school. Observe the conduct of teachers. Examine their physical fitness and their dress. Check their knowledge of the subject they are teaching. Note their methods of teaching. Note the manner in which they handle their students. Note their attitude towards their students.
 - b) The visiting officer shall make arrangements for the inspection of the school buildings, equipment of schools, water closets, food and mess, health and safety of children, arrangement of work, written cleanliness and maintenance, sports training, etc. comprising the other activities of the school.
2. The visiting officer shall assess the general condition of students' position vis-a-vis performance of each pupil. Data may be collected through Descriptive Test, created by the Pupil Assessment Bureau and higher authorities.
3. Any conclusion drawn shall include a brief comment of the general health of pupils and the findings of special highlights of the visit based on observations.
4. The visiting officer shall submit his report to the Director of Education on behalf of the government.
5. The visiting officer shall enter an acknowledgement in report form that:-
 - a) The report of the visiting officer shall be submitted with programs and recommendations in the prescribed format. The officer shall indicate if he has and acknowledge writing on the relevant form.
