Dear Deputy Commissioner,

The true spirit of democracy lies in the active involvement of people in decision making processes to fulfill their area specific needs. - 6. I am sure that working together, through this programme, we will be able to bring about a discernible and positive change in the rural landscape of the state and leave an indelible impression on the lives of the people residing in our villages.
