- iii. Departments with most complaints against staff a) P.D. b) Water Works c) P.D.
- iv. Any specific observation regarding any particular department. Drinking water supplied by PDS is often contaminated & not fit for consumption. The next best alternative drinking water is obtained from untested handpumps all round the village with the water being thrown away. It is mixed with polluted water which is supplied to the general public, so unnecessary need to be replaced. Transport (GP) seats at railway station reservation being severely 'illegally' wasted.

7. Fire & emergencies ^{are} absent in the area.

1. Upgradation of Hospital from PHE to Govt with construction of boundary wall & lifting electricity
2. Upgradation of current Filtration Plant converting it to Naranyi water scheme
3. Road from Doussona to Pandit Mohalla along Lar canal should be under modernized
4. Lifting irrigation pump (3 pump sets) should be installed on Lar canal up to last end point of land of Jalandhar
5. Hostel, Store building & BMS building with computer lab & play ground
6. Boundary wall to all irrigation channels from Lar canal to the end
7. Check Dams & Boundary wall to all
