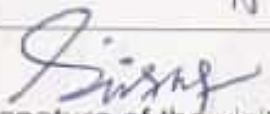
The department of PHE has in its worst condition I have ever seen. The majority of the population is without drinking water. They are drinking to get the water from the dry pipes which have laid many years before.
