- x. The visiting officer shall inspect major languishing projects, inaugurate playgrounds (if any), participate in exhibition melas, distribution of certificates, etc.
- xi. The officer shall during all his interactions emphasize on education, nutrition and health of children, empowerment of women, general cleanliness, solid waste management, organic farming, vermi-composting, rain water harvesting and water conservation.

Remarks : Community Health Centre is available in the same village at a distance of 0.5 km in adjacent Panchayat Halka Zachaldara -B. However the same is with inadequate staff, medicines and equipments. People during interaction stated that the CHC was upgraded to District Hospital with all the sanctioned strength of staff as per norms. However during onspot visit it was revealed by the staff that the government has kept the order vis-a-vis B-Grade specialist and the other related staff in abeyance. People demanded revocation of that order and restoration of Status CHC to SDH. People further demanded that till that is done by the Government, the posting of all the sanctioned staff of CHC be made on immediate basis for the effective health care of the area. There is one post of Dental Surgeon available in the CHC, but the same is being used for drawal of salary of Dental

Surgeon performing duties at some other place. People demanded immediate posting of Dental Surgeon. There is also solar plant installed in the hospital premises but is not functional due to some technical problem. People demanded that the solar plant is required to be relocated at the roof top of the newly constructed concrete building and its maintenance as and when required.

1. Establishment of Degree College at Zachaldara , being the centrally located place for as many as 60 villages and is having three feeding Higher Secondary Schools at present. Besides also the proposal of three storey building for Higher Secondary School comprising of 21 rooms is pending in the Education Department Civil Secretariat requires to be expedited for approval.

2. Out of four buildings in the Higher Secondary premises 03 are unsafe which are required to be demolished for the safety of students. The Hostel building of ST Candidates in the premises of higher secondary may be provisionally provided to the Higher secondary school for teaching purposes till some alternate arrangement for space is made. The ST Candidates are not available in the area and the Hostel is not being used for any purpose.

3. Introduction of new subjects like Geography, Biotechnology, Biochemistry, Commerce, Arabic, Sociology, Financial studies and Management in the Higher Secondary School.

4. Auditorium, updated library and Moving Science Laboratory for Higher Secondary School.

Remarks : The panchayat halqa has the potential for all the above activities. Departmental wise general awareness campaign regarding various government schemes is need of the hour. People demanded that the procedure for availing the benefit under various schemes is also required to be simplified. People also pointed out that Tillers provided by the department are at exorbitant rates as compared to the market rate and demanded that this needs to be looked into.

Remarks. On Urse Mubarak of Dastageer Sahib a Mela is also being organised in every year. There is huge rush of devotees and the ziyarat sharief lacks the facility of bathrooms and others related issues which caused great inconvenience to the public and devotees at large. The people demanded that this can be developed as a religious tourism and all the facilities be provided to it including construction of required number of bathrooms which will also play a vital role in upliftment of the Village and will make the life of villagers better.


