



The Back to Village programme is aimed to involve the People of the State and government offices in their effort to deliver the mission of sustainable development. The programme is aimed at emerging the government and directing development efforts in rural areas through community participation.

As part of this programme, all segments will have to remain and to work towards the place, where they will stay for a specific period of time and obtain feedback from the grassroots to be able to better Governmental Institutions in providing delivery of village-specific services.

The Back to Village programme has been conducted with the objective of ensuring that developmental initiatives are built on the needs and aspiration of the people, thus being more result oriented with lesser probability of success than those which are top down.

The programme teaches about the concept that while the official machinery has to guide and lead, the primary responsibility to represent and connect with the people lies with them. Therefore, they must be encouraged to own a programme so that benefits are maximized.

The life of a person living in a rural area is not cut into segments. Therefore the Government activities are prone to be. The approach here is to build, therefore, has to be a holistic, touching all aspects of life. Such an approach has to be made, not through a bunch of departmental officials but through Panchayats.


