	As per the locals here, they suffered heavily from economic point of view after a ban came into effect on the extraction of stones from the nearby mining hills. If feasible revoke the ban so that economy is improved.

	on my visit of this EP, I found people satisfied with some depths and not satisfied with some. Though there is a provision for development in all depths. P.D.D and P.H.E and Irrigation are the fields that needs to be taken care of. Drainage is poor in the link roads and there is need of patching & black toping.
