Subject:- Redressal of genuine demands, specific grievances
and development requirements of village welfare.

MST Sirs, I request to your kind consideration that
the General public of village Wahidpora has approached
to the village welfare committee raised from about the redressal
of genuine demands, specific grievances and developmental
requirements specified as under for your sympathetic
consideration in the following detail:-

"Genuine demands:

1. Declaration backlog of village welfare:
The village welfare consists of 300 (Three hundred) families
(poor) more having five households are very poor and
belongs to a very backwarded area total, district Ganderbal
requires to be declared backwarded area in Ganderbal
district on top priority basis.
2. District / Primary Health Centre:
Being huge population of village welfare in the
adjacent areas, require to facilitate [provides the
primary health centre for the said area on top
priority basis]
3. Transport facility:
The transport facility in the village from residents
to tehsil has and district Ganderbal has not been help
by the govt. for the welfare of poor people of the area
in absence of transport facility the general public

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facing with difficulties. In this connection the Bus/Minibus service requires to be deployed on priority basis.

b) F.C.I., Irrigation and R.R. & Stores:

The Food Corporation of India, Irrigation and R.R. & Stores situated inside of the three way road near the bus stop of village Nalihinda are not in a suitable place, creates the problem of their transport suppliers and there is apprehension of frequent public accidents.

In this connection it was suggested to remove these stores and shift to the available land of Off Gyanbal Pabbi Enchashed by the illegal Stone Quarry exists in Survey no. 14375 min of village Lakhisara of these stores. This action can be accorded on top priority basis.

c) Development Requirements:

i) Tourism Sector:

The village Nalihinda situated on the bank of beautiful Nalihinda, it a health resort place needs its development for Tourism Sector, creates employment for poor people of the area. Undoubtedly this suggestion on priority basis.

ii) Upgradation of Middle School Nalihinda:

The population of village Nalihinda and its adjacent village are increasing. The said school need sufficient land situated on the bank of beautiful Nalihinda, health resort place. Undoubtedly upgrade the said school with High and Higher Education level on priority basis.

iii) Widening of Roads:

In the road leading from Nalihinda to tehsil has become very narrow, the traffic stress is enough on the road, which require road widening on priority basis. The best site claim as the present road already to be constructed.

iii) The illegal encroachments made by the illegal Stone Crushers on the agricultural land of Gramin Patta were difficult for the general people to attend their Orchard fields frequently. Windy climate due to the stones to remove the encroachments made on the agricultural land of Gramin Patta on priority basis.

C) Grievances: "Stop to illegal functioning of Stone Crushers"

1. Due to the functioning of illegal two stone crushers, producing terrible dust pollution, noise pollution and nuisances, badly affected the over all economy including agriculture, vegetables and horticulture production in the surrounding area.
2. We have approached to the Member Secretary Jhull Gramin Prayagraj State Pollution Control Board Jamun and copies thereof addressed to the concerned dignitaries vide no. 122-32 dated 27-11-2005 (copy enclosed). But unfortunately no action has been initiated till date.
3. We have also approached to the Divisional Commissioner Haldia through the Hon'ble Divisional Commissioner - Dug Utsab the order dated 11-01-2006 (copy enclosed) about the stop and removal of existing Stone Crushers. But no action has been initiated till date by the authorities.

Having in view the above demands kindly take care of specific grievances, may kindly be considered sympathetically forthwith. For which we will be thankful to you.

Subject: Immediate stop comment to operate (Renewal) to illegal two stone crushers at Wahidpora, Theroo, and Wasalbagh in the best interest of General Public.

Ref. No: General Public of Wahidpora Theroo and Wasalbagh's application No. II/WP/10/407 dt: 19-10-2013.

Sir,

Most respects, I request to your kind consent that the General Public of Wahidpora, Theroo and Wasalbagh village has approached to the village Welfare Committee Wahidpora about the 2009 grant to consent (Renewal) for further functioning of illegal two stone crushers i.e M/S Bhat Stone crusher Wasalbagh and M/S Azamur Stone crusher Wahid-pora on the following grounds:

- That the said crushers are being run illegally at Wahidpora Theroo and Wasalbagh on the road side, behind the bank of health resort Nullaundi.
- That the illegal two stone crushers stands installed during disturbing period in absence of no objection (in the private land of Wahidpora and Theroo) of General Public and proper permission of revenue authorities.
- That the work of the illegal crushers severely encroaches in the private land of affected villages in proportion to report of Tehnikiar has submitted to Development Commissioner, Ganderbal vide their no. 188/DQ/TL dt: 10-07-2015 (copy enclosed). The occupation of private land by stone crushers violated the judicial set and directions of Hon'ble High court.
- That due to the functioning of illegal two stone crushers, protecting terribly our pollution, noise pollution, and nuisance and badly affected the over all economy including agriculture, vegetables and Horticulture production in the surrounding area.
- That the thousands of acres of Kachraee land have turned into deep ditches by excavating of stones (boulders) which effected the cattle and sheep rearing in this rural area.
- That due to the illegal functioning of two stone crushers the level of the Nullaundi has come down by 25ft which has effected the irrigation water facilities to the agriculture land, which has become barren and non-productive.

- That the General public has highlighted the illegal functioning of two stone crushers through daily newspapers i.e. "The Daily Tribune" of 28-03-2012, "The Daily Aaj" - "The Daily Magazine" and "The daily (Bhart Khabar)" on 13-11-2015. (Photocopies of these papers are enclosed for your reference and information).
- That this matter has already been taken up with concerned Development Commissioners, J&K, Ganderbal and respective Divisional Commissars over & about in time, they have taken notice about the illegal functioning of some crushers in the Public pasture land reported from the report of revenue authorities. They have agreed the directions of the Hizbul High court will be implemented by removing and removing the said illegal stone crushers existing in the pasture land of interested villages or course.
- That the General Public of the aforesaid villages are very serious and are at risk for demolishing the illegal functioning of these particular stone pollution craters existing in the pasture land of General Public. The same number owners maintaining stocking herd and cattle raise languages with General public listing their mistakes. It appears that that it is a systematic misnomer incident throughout the disputed area. The responsibility lies upon your department due to issuing orders to operate (Rencra) for functioning of illegal iron smelting units in the aforesaid pasture land.
- That the General public has genuine reasons and come to come back to press this problem.

Keeping in view the above facts, it is much requested kindly to look into the matter and take immediate steps to stop the further grant of consent to operate (Rencra) of the illegal functioning of the aforesaid two stone crushers as well and effec-

ORDER

This application has been filed by the Village Welfare Committee, Wahipora Grampanchayat through the Chairman praying thereto to stop the functioning of illegal stone crushers existing on Kachchari land.

Heard the applicants and the proprietors of stone crushers - Advocates Shrikant Hossain and Asif Ahmad who filed power of attorney on behalf of the non-applicants. The applicants reiterated to the stand taken application and stated that functioning of the illegal stone crushers is causing damage to the Kachchari land at village Wahipora and Theesu around it, throughout the adjacent area and has badly affected the economy including agriculture, vegetable and horticulture production. The crusher owners are extracting boulders illegally from Nalai Singh resulting the adjacent villages are facing tremendous problem during rainy season. The Tehsildar concerned submitted a report file No. 525/QC/L dated 03-01-2016 states therein that the three crushers namely Ehsan Stone Crusher and Asif Stone Crusher are existing in Kachchari Land bearing survey No. 7 in estate Wahipora. That same land from survey No. 375 lies in State Land in estate Theesu is being used for dumping of crusher material by 2/3 Asif Stone Crusher being adjacent to its land. He has further stated that the inhabitants of village Wahipora are facing tremendous difficulties due to the terrible and productive pollution coming out from those stone crushers. This fact re-affirms the accusation made by the applicants that the areas are affected badly due to the functioning of those stone crushers.

Keeping in view the above mentioned facts, this application is disposed of and the direction is issued to Tehsildar QDO, Srinagar that they shall stop the functioning of above named stone crushers forthwith and remove the encroachment made on Kachchari and bearing survey No. 375 in estate Wahipora within two weeks time and submit compliance report to the court in this behalf. Deputy Commissioner, Srinagar is also directed to recover the income generated from those Crushers since 1995 less by local charges incurred by the functioning of the stone crushers and deposit the amount in Government Treasury for developmental purpose of Wahipora and Theesu areas.
