Panchayat is functioning properly & has good reach to public & gram Sabha meetings are being conducted. However Panchayat Ghar was gutted & its reconstruction process is going on & hopefully will be completed in near future.

Most Respect, I request to your kind. Consider that
the General Public of village wahidpora has approached
to the village welfare Committee wahidpora about the redressal
of Genuine demands, specific grievances and development
requirements. Specific as under for your sympathetic
consideration in the following points:-

"A" Genuine demands

1. Declaration back class of village wahidpora:

The village wahidpora consisting of 250 (Two hundred) families
(houses) more having five bachelors are very poor and
belongs to a very backward area, which requires
to be declared backward area in Ganderbal
district on top priority basis.

2. District / Primary health centre:

Being a huge population of village wahidpora and its
adjacent areas, require to facilitate / provide the
primary health centre for the said area on top
priority basis.

3. Transport facility:

The transport facility in the village from wahidpora
to tehal has and district Ganderbal has not been kept
by the Govt. for the welfare of poor people of the area.
In absence of transport facility the general public

facing with difficulties. In this connection the Bus/
Motor Service requests to be deployed on priority basis.
4. F.C.I., Irrigation and R & B Schemes;

The food Corporation of India, Irrigation and R & B Schemes
situated inside of the thar way road near the bus stop
of village waidhara are not in a suitable place, create
the jamming of their transport supplies and there is
apprehension of frequent public accidents.

In this connection it was suggested to remove
these stores and shift to the vacant land of
of General Public Encroached by the illegal Stone
Crusher exists in Survey no. 14375 min of village
waidhara & thar. Hope action can be accorded
on top priority basis.

B Development Schemes:

1) Tourist Sector:

The village waidhara situated on the bank of beautiful
Nalla Bindh, is a health resort place needs its develop-
ment for Tourist Sector, create employment for
poor people of the area. kindly consider this
suggestion on priority basis.

2) upgradation of middle school waidhara:

The population of village waidhara and its adjacent

on priority basis.

3) Widening of Roads:

In the road leading from waidhara to telit has
become very narrow, the Traffic Street is enough on
the road, which requires road widening on priority basis.
the both sides drain of the ~~road~~ road of waidhara also require to be
constructed.

iv) The illegal encroachment made by the illegal Stone Crushers on the Maheshwar land of Jammu Public trust is difficult for the general people to attend their Orchard, fields frequently. Kindly direct the authorities to remove the encroachment made by made on the Maheshwar land of Jammu Public trust on priority basis.

"C" Grievances: "Stop the illegal functioning of Stone Crushers"

1. Due to the functioning of illegal two Stone crushers, producing terrible dust pollution, noise pollution and nuisance, badly affected the over all economy including agriculture, vegetables and horticulture production in the surrounding area.
2. We have approached to the Member Secretary Jammu/Jammu State Pollution Control Board Jammu and Copied memo/letter dated to the concerned dignitaries vide no 122-32 dated 27-11-2015 (Copy enclosed) But unfortunately no action has been initiated till to date.
3. We have also approached to the Divisional Commissioner Jammu Province the Honble Divisional Commissioner has issued the order dated 11-01-2016 (Copy enclosed) about the stop and removal of existing Stone Crushers. But no action has been initiated till date by the authorities.

Keeping in view the above demands thereby requirements of specific grievance, may kindly be consider sympathetically for which we be thankful to you.

Subject: Immediate stop consent to operate (Renewal) to illegal two stone crushers at Wahidpora, Theroo, and Watalbagh in the best interest of General Public.

Ref. No: General Public of Wahidpora Theroo and Watalbagh's application No. III/WP/104-07 dt: 19-10-2015.

Sir,

Most respects, I request to your kind consent that the General Public of Wahidpora, Theroo and Watalbagh village has approached to the village Welfare Committee Wahidpora about the stop grant to consent (Renewal) for further functioning of illegal two stone crushers i.e. M/S (Shaf Stone) crushers Watalbagh and M/S Azamur Stone crushers Wahid ura on the following grounds:

- That the said crushers are being run illegally at Wahidpora Theroo and Watalbagh on the road side, behind the peak of health resort Nallasindh.
- That the illegal two stone crushers stands installed during disturbing period in absence of no objection in the pasture land of Wahidpora and Theroo of General Public and proper permission of revenue authorities.
- That the status of the illegal crushers presently exists in the pasture land of abroad villages in proportion to report of Tehsildar has submitted to Development Commissioner, Ganderbal vide their no. DR/OQ/11 dt: 10-07-2015 (copy enclosed). The occupation of pasture land by stone crushers violated the restriction set and directions of Hon'ble High court.
- That due to the functioning of illegal two stone crushers, producing terribly dust pollution, noise pollution, and nuisance and badly affected the over all economy including agriculture, vegetables and Horticulture production in the surrounding area.
- That the thousands of cumls of Kachayee land have turned into deep ditches by excavating of stones (boulders) which effected the cattle and sheep rearing in this rural area.
- That due to the illegal functioning of two stone crushers the level of the Nallasindh has come down by 25ft which has effected the irrigation water facilities to the agriculture land which has become barren and non-productive.

- That the General public has highlighted the illegal functioning of two stone crushers through daily newspapers i.e. "The daily Rohtak" of 28/11/2013, "The daily Ahar" "The daily Mahanad" and "The daily (Bharat Khabar)" on 13/11/2013. Photocopy of these papers are enclosed for your reference and information.
 - Since the matter has already been taken up with concerned Development Commissioner, Jharkhand, Gandhinagar and respected Divisional Commissioner Kachin in turn, they have taken serious about the illegal functioning of stone crushers in the Public pasture land appears from the report of revenue authorities. They have agreed the directions of the Hon'ble High court will be implemented by banning and removing the said illegal stone crushers exists in the pasture land of aforesaid villages of course.
 - That the General Public of the aforesaid villages are very serious and are at pains for demolishing the illegal functioning of stone crushers (noise pollution) existing in the pasture land of General Public. The stone crusher owners misbehaving screaming and using rude languages with General public hitting their mistakes. It appears that there is apprehension amongst incidents throughout the disputed area. The responsibility does not come department due to issuing consent to operate (Renewal) for functioning of illegal stone crushers in the objected pasture land.
 - That the General public has genuine reasons and come to come forth to press their problems. Keeping in view the above facts, it is as well requested, kindly to look into the matter and take immediate steps to stop the further grant of consent to operate (Renewal) of the illegal functioning of the aforesaid two stone crushers as well and obliged.

11. This application has been filed by the Village Welfare Committee, Wandurda
12. Gunderbal through the Chairman praying them to stop the functioning of illegal stone crushers
13. existing on Kitchan land.

Heard the applicants and the proprietors of stone crushers - Anoopam Singh of Hae Takray and Agar Ahmad Bhat had power of attorney on behalf of the non-applicants. The applicants reiterated to the stand taken application and stated that functioning of the illegal stone crushers existing in the Kachhara land at village Wadhpora and Theora caused nuisance throughout the airport area and had badly affected the primary including agriculture vegetable and horticulture production. The crusher owners are extracting business illegally from Nation Smith resulting the adjacent villages are facing tremendous problem during rainy season. The Tehsildar concerned submitted a report vide No. 529/O/C/L dated 08/07/2016 stating therein that the stone crushers namely Bhat Stone Crusher and Agar Stone Crusher are existing in Kachhara Land bearing survey No. 1 in estate Wadhpora. That some land from survey No. 375/Am (State Land) in estate Theora is being utilized for dumping of crusher material by 12% Agar Stone Crushers being adjacent to it and. He has further stated that the inhabitants of village Wadhpora are facing tremendous difficulties due to the terrible dust produced by the machines coming out from these stone crushers. This fact is affects the avian life of the applicants that the birds are affected badly due to the functioning of these stone crushers.

Keeping in view the above mentioned facts, the application is allowed in view of directions issued by H.O. who that they shall stop the furnishing of above stated stone crushers forthwith and remove the encroachment made on Kanchanpur and bearing survey No. 1 and 275 M in estate Wahidpore within two week's time and submit compliance report to the court in this behalf. Deputy Commissioner, Ganda has also directed to recover the income generated from these crushers since 1993 less by local charges incurred for the functioning of the same crushers and deposit the amount in Government Treasury for developmental purpose of Wahidpore and Tharyn area.
