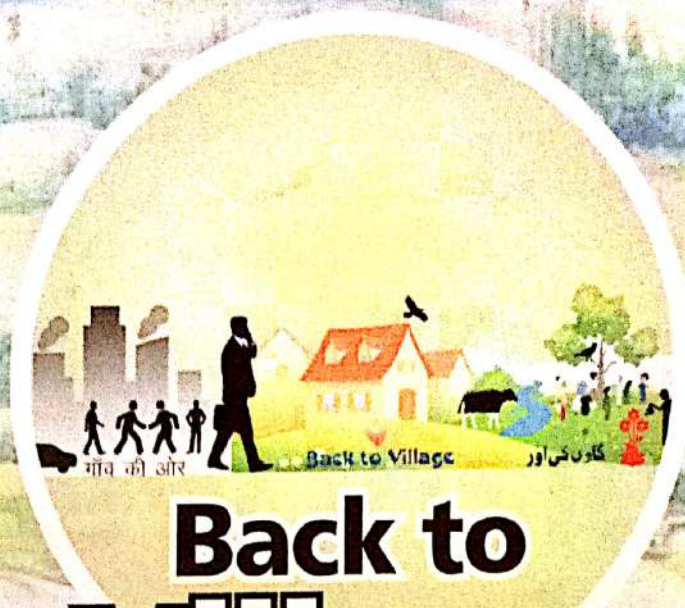

VI Overall assessment of visit (Public Services): Please mention best practices, if any, observed

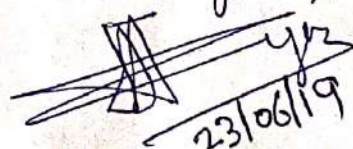
Though some departments like RDD, Health, ASHA & PDD / Veterinary dept are performing their services in a good manner yet there is plenty of room to improve it further. Other departments are having public anguish for their poor service and accessibility. The departments with complaints are PHE, social welfare, flood central, irrigation. In fact EP is very poor and is susceptible to frequent floods which has discouraged the public to move forward in any sector.

VII Overall assessment of visit (Panchayat Functioning):

PRI representatives are performing their services/activities in comparatively better manner. They take inhabitants of EP in confidence while discharging their duties/services. Several works are being executed under MNREGA & 14th FC. People are satisfied with the role of PRI, however, people need more awareness about schemes and funds allocated to Panchayat under both MNREGA and 14th FC. Social Audit Committee was formed in EP with 5 members. This committee needs to be encouraged to take ownership and drive the Panchayat for the welfare of public of EP.
