Although Panchayat has no road connectivity, PHE has ensured good quality drinking water, though it is irregular. Moreover, teachers in schools, despite very low salaries, are putting efforts to provide regular teaching classes to students.

Gram Sabha (including Panchs & Sarpanchs) is quite ignorant / unaware about the powers / functions / working of Gram Panchayats. Due to this ignorance they are unable to execute which has caused extremely low level of development in the area. Moreover, lack of support from Govt. departments & non-redressal of their grievances has resulted in pessimism & disappointment towards Govt. institutions / Govt. machinery.

"Back to Village"- General Observation Report

Gram Panchayat: Adhwa, **Block:** Ramban, **District:** Ramban, **Date of visit:** 20-21st June, 2019
Reporting Officer: Rana Ravinder Singh, Assistant Director (P&S), Information Technology Department, Civil Secretariat, J&K

Seldom does an officer sitting in his office chamber in Civil Secretariat gets an opportunity to visit and come face to face with the population living in far flung inaccessible areas of the State. "Back to Village" program being conducted in the entire State of J&K from 20-27th June, 2019 has given such one opportunity to the officers to actually experience the life and difficulties faced by the rural population of J&K State. As Father of the Nation, Mahatami Gandhi used to say that real India lives in villages, this unique & ambitious program has given the Government officers a chance to find out how far the Gram Panchayats have been empowered and what is the quantum of discrepancy between the official records and the ground reality. This is an effort towards bringing Governance at the doorsteps of the people rather than other way around.

The undersigned was assigned Gram Panchayat Adhwa of Block & District Ramban, which he visited from 20-21st June, 2019. The undersigned, given the short time and up to his best capacity, tried to meet and reach out to maximum number of people of the said Panchayat during his visit. The stay included inspection of the public institutions, public utilities, natural resources and interaction with different strata of population. The following is the general observation of the undersigned regarding different aspects of the Gram Panchayat Adhwa, which he gathered during his two days visit/stay in the said Panchayat.

1. **Gram Panchayat:** The Gram Panchayat Adhwa consists of one revenue village: Adhwa and seven wards namely: Darbote, Biba, Bhatta, Batiya, Showra, Ghar Shali & Tharmulla. The extent of Panchayat is vast and wards like Darbote & Tharmulla are quite distant from the central location. The Gram Panchayat has a reserved woman seat for Sarpanch, two reserved Panch seats for women, two reserved Panch seats for SC and three Panch seats for General category. Smt. Rekha Devi is the current Sarpanch of Adhwa Panchayat. The Panchayat does not have a Panchayat Ghar and its construction is languishing since many years.
2. **Area:** The whole area is hilly with difficult terrain. There are places of dense forests, but generally a large chunk has been deforested to accommodate for farming, housing and for use of timber, firewood etc.
3. **People:** People of the area are simple and mostly illiterate. There is presence of almost 35% SC population, and STs. The female literacy, especially of the adult population is very low. In fact, the Sarpanch and one of the women Panchs, is illiterate. Still the people have a strong urge for development but in absence of basic facilities there is a

sense of pessimism amongst them. The scant and unequal nature of development has divided the population who are more focused on their respective wards/areas rather than on the development of the whole Panchayat. For instance, the people of Darbote & Tharmulla wards who are located at upper reaches feel that whatever small work/development has taken place in the area over the years has been limited to relatively accessible ward of Batiya, while the upper areas/wards have remained underdeveloped.

4. **Accessibility:** There is no road connectivity to the Panchayat. It is strange that even after so many years of independence no connectivity has been provided to 2000 odd souls of this area. It cannot be stressed enough that in absence of roads no development can take place in the area. As per the villagers a road was sanctioned from Kunda to Bhatta (Adhwa) via Shaldon, but the road construction work has been stopped at Shaldon. The people demanded that the road should be extended from Shaldon to Bhatta via Gwalion as was actually envisaged under the project. Another genuine demand is for of a link road from Ramban to Adhwa so that the Gram Panchayat is well connected with the Ramban town. They demanded that this road be sanctioned under PMGSY and not NABARD as the scope of land compensation is more if road is sanctioned under PMGSY project. Unless the road connectivity is provided, no economic or social development can take place in the area. People of the Adhwa panchayat are forced to live an isolated life in this accessibility and technologically advanced era, which is criminal on the part of administration.
5. **Economy:** People are mostly engaged in farming activity which they produce for their self-consumption. A few people constitute the labour class who migrate/commute to the nearest town of Ramban to earn their livelihood. A few are also earning their livelihood from MGNREGA. But locals have complained that payments of a number of works under MGNREGA have not been disbursed to the people. Payments of some of the works done under MGNREGA are pending since 2016. They complained that they had done the work on the directions of district officers of RDD, but since many years they have not received their dues. As a result, most of them are under severe stress of loans they had taken from relatives/acquaintances. People still do not have the job cards, while the Gram Rozgar Sevak (GRS) apprised the Panchayat that the same were ready and assured to distribute them amongst the people in a couple of days. People also complained that because of the frequent transfers of GRS, no progress could be achieved under MGNREGA. They demanded that GRS should be appointed for at-least an year so that villagers could keep a track of the progress of the work. The Panchayat has good scope/potential for Horticulture, Apiculture, Organic Farming, Plantation of Medicinal/Aromatic plants, Dairy farming, controlled Mining/Quarrying of Gypsum etc. which can only be exploited once the Panchayat is well connected through road connectivity.

6. **Health:** The Panchayat has no health sub centre. The people complained that no doctor or paramedic visits them. The panchayat has only two Aangan Wari Centres (AWCs) and two ASHA workers. The AWCs are located in private houses. Since the households are located from quite a distant from one another, people demanded that there should be one AWC in each ward in the Panchayat. The undersigned observed that people were reluctant to send their children to the AWCs because of the distance they had to travel to reach them. Because of the distance and difficult terrain, the movement of ASHA workers within the panchayat was also very limited. In absence of any health facility, it is obvious that the people of the area are being deprived of their fundamental right to life and their right to accessible health. People unequivocally demanded a Health Centre in their Panchayat with requisite medical staff to cater to their health needs.
7. **Education:** There are four Primary schools, two Middle schools and one High school in the Panchayat. What was dismal about all these schools was that none of them had a boundary wall and requisite infrastructure. In such hilly area, absence of boundary walls in school has every possibility of causing a fatal incident. Further, in absence of required number of desks/chairs, children had no option but to sit on ground. The undersigned observed that the High school Batiya and Middle school Adhwa were running from just two rooms. One of the buildings of high school was unsafe for children. There were no laboratories, library, or playground for the children. There were very less number of teachers present in the schools against the sanctioned strength. Most of the teachers were either absent or were deputed/attached elsewhere. In fact the High school Batiya had no Mathematics and Hindi teacher since long. The Mid Day Meal in schools was very irregular. No menu was displayed in the schools. In fact there was no rice available in the High school when the undersigned visited. The Mid Day Meal had not been served for the past one month in High school. The staff told that rice was not being provided to them. Moreover, they complained that no carriage charges were being provided to them for fetching the ration from Ramban town to the schools uphill. They demanded that either carriage charges should be paid or arrangements should be made to bring the ration directly to the schools. People demanded that Upper Primary School Adhwa (established: 1965) should be upgraded to High school with better infrastructure such as more rooms to accommodate children, a science laboratory, library and playground. They demanded that computer laboratories should be established in the High schools so that children acquire the necessary IT skills. Moreover, they demanded that teachers should be available in the schools as per its sanctioned strength. Further, they demanded that construction of Middle School and High School building at Batiya should be completed with all the requisite infrastructure (laboratory, library, playground) at the earliest as

it was a languishing project since many years. Because of incomplete school buildings/projects, students (1-10th class) were forced to sit in a two-room building.

8. **Sanitation:** Although on records the Adhwa Panchayat has been given Open Defecation Free (ODF) status, but in reality nearly 70 % of population stills defecates in the open. People and Gram Panchayat complained that authorities did not pay any heed to their demands/suggestions. The people whom they recommended for toilet construction under Swatchh Bharat Abhiyan-Grameen (SBA-G), rarely got the benefit, while non priority people availed of the benefits. The undersigned advised people to build a community Sanitation toilet complex in each ward and inculcate the habit of using toilets. The undersigned also initiated a cleanliness drive in the panchayat as a token gesture for introducing cleanliness and good sanitary habits in the area.
9. **Public Distribution System (PDS):** There is no PDS ration depot in the panchayat and people had to fetch their ration from PDS shop in Ramban town for which no carriage allowance was being given to them. Being a hilly area, the carriage charges of materials adds a major cost component to the overall cost which distorts the cost composition of schemes/projects and makes them unviable. People unequivocally demanded a PDS Ration Depot in the Panchayat as their basic necessity.
10. **Electricity (Power supply):** Many of the hamlets especially in Darbot and Tharmulla wards of Adhwa Panchayat were without electricity. The entire Panchayat remains dark for about 4 months during winter season from December to mid April. The HT/LT lines were mostly taking the support of trees to be in place. At many of the places the wires were short/loose and were very close to the ground creating chance of a fatal incident. Panchayat is currently short of about 200 LT and 50 HT poles. In event of a power breakdown, locals themselves along with a line man who had not been paid by PDD since past 20 years, rectify the fault. They reported that it took around 2 months for a faulty transformer to be restored. The Panchayat had 5 transformers (4 working), which according to PDD official (line man Mr. Vicky) and local people were insufficient. People demanded at-least three (3) more transformers at Digi, Biba and Tharmulla to meet the electric power demand of people of the area.
11. **Water:** The villagers on an average received around 2 hours of irregular water supply daily during summers while the supply was mostly scant and irregular during winters. The Vashigraat nallah in Adhwa Panchayat caters to the drinking water demands of Ramban town but the locals still yearned for it. The people demanded at-least two reservoirs in Darbot & Biba wards to cater to the water demand of people. They demanded that a new line Chapran-Bhatan-Bhata Middle school-Kund should be laid. In addition, Chapran-Biba-Darbot-Batiya and Dalian-Baloti-Tharmulla lines should also be laid. Moreover, upgradation of Vashigraat-Batiya-Behrani-Ramban-Shour Gali lines

should be ensured. The undersigned advised the locals to use water harvesting techniques to meet their household and irrigation demands and shared with them different techniques/schemes of water/rainwater harvesting. He also suggested to them the need for preserving the water bodies of the area.

12. **Tourism potential:** Adhwa Panchayat has good tourism potential provided there is road connectivity to the area. The Pachtatahi area of the panchayat is just like Pahalgam of Kashmir province with vast meadows and picturesque scenery. The ancient *Kaalimata* temple and *Ram Mandir* (Vaashigraat) could become attractions for religious tourism. Moreover, since the whole area is hilly, it is apt for trekking and the upper reaches provide scope for paragliding (adventure tourism). Further, area could be developed as meditation and Yoga Centre as has been done in Mc-Leodganj in Himachal Pradesh.
13. **Telecom connectivity:** The telecom connectivity is uncertain in the area. While Reliance Jio has provided 4g connectivity in some areas of the Panchayat, the upper reaches of the Panchayat are still without a network provider.
14. **Banking:** There is no banking presence in the area. Nearest bank branch is at-least 12 kms away in Ramban town. There is no post office or Common Service Centre in the Panchayat. There is also no presence of Bank Sevaks in the area.
15. **Housing:** People complained that deserving beneficiaries were not getting benefits under PM Awaas Yojana (PMAY). There were around 200 households yet to be covered under PMAY. Only 5 out of 14 eligible households (2016-17) and 20 out of 57 eligible households (2017-18) had received benefit under PMAY, while no registration was done by District Administration in F.Y 2018-19.
16. **General awareness about Rural development and Panchayati Raj:** People of the Panchayat were mostly ignorant of their rights/roles and powers. They were disappointed in Rural Development Department and District Administration for not doing anything substantial for them in so many years. The Panchayat told the undersigned that they had been visited by an officer for the first time since almost 4 decades. They complained about the apathy shown by the district administration for not attending to their basic needs which had forced them to live in isolation and poverty with very bleak future. The Panchayat had scant knowledge of the Govt. schemes. They also did not have the knowledge of 14th Finance commission and divulgence of power. They did not know how to frame Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP). The earlier GRS and VLWs had shared very little knowledge with them and the Panchayat was mostly in dark. In fact, the current GRS did not have the earlier Panchayat register/Panchayat proceeding documents with him as the same were with

the previous GRS who was recently transferred. The undersigned made the Panchayat aware of its role and responsibilities, its powers and accountability. He also gave knowledge of plan formulation and priorities to be set during its formulation. He stressed on such asset creation in Panchayat which in turn could generate revenue for them. The undersigned stressed on transparency in working of Panchayats so that people could grow faith in them. The undersigned also constituted Social Audit Committee (SAC) comprising of members from different sections such as Women, SC, ST, ex-Servicemen, retired teachers, OBCs etc. and educated them about their mandate and role.

17. **General observation:** The Panchayat has potential to grow as has been discussed in the previous points. But the foremost requisite is the road connectivity to the Panchayat. Once the Panchayat is well accessible, the undersigned feels that rest of the basic necessities would follow. Apart from road, a health sub Centre and PDS ration depot are also a must in the Panchayat. Up gradation of schools as already mentioned and completion of languishing projects should also be a top priority. Since the Panchs and Sarpanchs themselves are unaware of their role, thorough training should be provided to them wherein they are made aware of their role/powers and scope. Moreover, they should also be made aware of the Govt. schemes and their guidelines and grievance redressal mechanism in case VLW, GRS or other public authorities do not cooperate. This would surely build a sense of belief and give confidence to the Panchayats and they would be able to deliver and make Grass root level Governance a success. Panchayats should firstly be suitably empowered on ground for them to be able to make any difference at village level.
