Message

In June 2016, Jammu & Kashmir embarked on a unique initiative "Back to Village". The project was both daunting and ambitious - a public outreach of this size and scale had never been attempted before, certainly not in a state like Jammu & Kashmir with its unique problems of geographic, climate and law apprehensions.

Undaunted by the skeptics and the naysayers we decided to go ahead with the programme. The response of the programme exceeded our own expectations. Everywhere the visiting officers were welcomed, loved and honoured. The affection and respect with which officers were received across geographical areas, for us, a testimony to the innate goodness and hospitality of the common people. The officers spent two days and a night with the people living with them, eating the same food, and learning first-hand the challenges and difficulties of their residence. For many it was a unique learning experience - the sweet taste of failure brought home to them the beautiful fruits of things - for others was a humbling experience as it laid bare to them the dignity which the rural population lives, notwithstanding the myriad challenges of their existence. Such was the enthusiasm generated by the programme that even the Deputy Commissioners to the Hon'ble Prime Minister about the programme following which the Prime Minister made a mention of it in his *Man of Steel* Programme calling it a *beacon of development, public participation and public awareness*.

Encouraged by the success of the first edition of the programme, we have now decided to initiate our 44 second phase. While the first phase of the programme was focused on listening, looking and assessing needs, the second phase intends to look more closely at the task of empowering, enabling and institutionalising the functioning of Panchayats. It is intended to strengthen Panchayats, not associate Panchayats. The other objective of the second phase of the programme will be to look at the various flagship programmes and individual, community oriented schemes and learn more about the implementation, governance, which ensures that full implementation and their disposal also be ascertained. The visiting officers would also study signature and other activities in the Panchayats, particularly with Panchayats of the national goal of doubling families income by 2022.

I am confident that our efforts both will once again rise to the occasion and replicate the success of the first edition of the programme. I am also confident that the Deputy Commissioners and Administrative Secretaries will create the necessary conditions for the visiting officers to discharge their role effectively. I am equally sure that this programme will evolve into an institutionalised, decentralised governance programme which will not only be a genuine, unadorned ear to the ground but will also cut the infamous red tape and help in delivering development better and faster.
