

Message

By June 2010, Johnson & Mathews embarked on a unique initiative "Back to Village". The project was both daunting and ambitious - a 100% outreach of the men and women had never before attempted before, certainly not in a state like Kansas. & Kansas with its unique problems of poverty, crime and less educated

Unscathed by the depths, and the newspapers we decided to go ahead with the programme. The response of the programme exceeded our own expectations. Everywhere the viewing figures were enormous, fond and favourable. The affection and respect with which citizens spoke increased across geographical lines, for us, a testimony to the shared goodness and humanity of the common people. The officers spent two days and a night with the people living out there, picking the corn field, and learning first hand the challenges and difficulties of their existence. For many those diverse learning experiences also served to re-ignite their desire to live their God-given lives of service. For others was a reminder of what they are capable of, from the clarity with which our population has re-understanding the respect and regard all men deserve. Such was the enthusiasm generated by the programme that prompted the great Dr. Martin to the *Han-Jie-Ping Minzu* about the programme, saying when the *Han-Jie-Ping Minzu* was a member of it as his Alter in *Ping* he had the pleasure of having discussions with both police and prison inmates.

By examining the success of the first actions of the programme, we have been able to move on to the second phase. Since the first phase of the programme will focus on publishing forecasts and discussing needs, the second phase intends to have more focus on the task of disseminating, analysing and establishing the functioning of agroforestry systems. However, they will evaluate Panhandle agroforests. The third stage aims at the review of the programme activities at the national level; the programme and its impact. It will also present outcomes and report more about the implemented programmes which have been fully implemented and their effects will be ascertained. This review allows us to study agriculture and other activities in the Panhandle, its future and the creation of sustainable and flourishing farmers' economy by 2050.

I am confident that our entire team will strive against time to the maximum and replicate the success of the first edition of the programme. I am also confident that the Deputy Commissioners and Intendentes Secretarios will create the necessary conditions for the visiting officials to carry out their role effectively. I am equally sure that this programme will contribute to an institution-based climate governance programme which will not only be a genuine contribution not to the ground but will also cut the interhouse red tape and help in genuine implementation and delivery and faster.

Message

One of the key elements of good governance is the empowerment of democratic institutions so that people become real partners in decision making. After the successful conduct of Panchayat Elections in 2018, it was essential to reach out to the people for getting their valuable feedback for making the functioning of the democratic institutions as vibrant and meaningful institutions of governance.

With a view to reaching out to every nook and corner of Jammu & Kashmir, the Government conceived Back to Village (B2V) programme, the first of its kind in Jammu & Kashmir. The programme which was organized from June 20-27, 2019, across all 4482 Panchayats focused on ongoing Panchayats, collecting feedback on delivery of government schemes/programmes, capturing specific economic potential and undertaking assessment of needs of the villages. People came out in droves to welcome the visiting officers and appreciated the initiative of the government. The initiative was widely acknowledged with Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi mentioning it in 'Mann Ki Baat' on 28th June, 2019. The scenario was visible and response so overwhelming and enthusiastic that some officers stayed in their Panchayats beyond the schedule.

Government has already released funds for the Panchayats to address the priority works identified during the first phase of B2V programme.

The B2V programme facilitates development of Panchayats with a sound financial base, it is important that the initiative is carried forward to assess the level of empowerment and institutionalisation of the Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) at the grassroots level vis-a-vis the impact of various ongoing programmes and welfare schemes on the rural populace. The feedback so obtained will help the government to take the various central and other government schemes/programmes in improving delivery of village-specific services and making the village life better in terms of required amenities and facilities. I am confident that B2V programme will evolve into an institutionalized, democratic governance programme, which will help to deliver timely and faster services and development.

I fervently appeal to Panchayat representatives as well as people to come forward to project their views before the visiting officers for strengthening the PRIs.

I would urge the Deputy Commissioners to coordinate the visit of officers to various Panchayat Haqdas for better outcomes.

I am confident that our officers who will be a part of the B2V programme will work indomitably to make the initiative a grand success.

General Instructions for the Visiting Officer Back to Village 2 (B2V2)

- i. A suggested activity schedule has been prepared for the visiting officer. It shall be incumbent on the officer to ensure that all activities and elements mentioned in the schedule are carried out/completed fully.
- ii. The visiting officer shall hold a meeting with the Deputy Commissioner of the district before undertaking the village visit. During the meeting he will be briefed about the action taken on the issues raised in the previous Back to Village visit in date and what else be given various documents, flyers and analyses.
- iii. Before undertaking the visit, officer must familiarise himself/herself with important schemes especially Panchayat schemes, rural income related programmes and individual beneficiary oriented programmes e.g. PM-Kisan, Dairy Entrepreneurship Development Scheme and Backyard Poultry Schemes, Pension Schemes etc. He/she must also be familiar with 1st FC, MDR and ICDS nutrition component).
- iv. During his visit, the officer shall participate in the Gram Sabha, unveil the Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) and also ensure the constitution of various committees including Panchayat Biodiversity Committee.
- v. He/she shall hold detailed deliberations in the Gram Sabha about the issues raised in Back to Village-1 and the follow up action taken on the same by the District administration and the various line departments. He/she shall also share the report card and critical gap analysis under Mission Antyodaya prepared by the District Administration with the Gram Sabha.
- vi. The visiting officer shall distribute the information flyers regarding 100% coverage of all beneficiary oriented schemes and also discuss the issue in the Gram Sabha. He will ensure that frontline workers accompanying him explain at least some of these schemes in detail to the people.
- vii. The officer should assess the level of functionality of the Panchayat, infrastructure available in the Panchayat, support provided to it by the officials and the difficulties being faced by it in implementing various developmental schemes. For the purpose he/she should hold detailed meetings with Panchayat members and also officials.

- vii. The visiting officer should try and visit as many local institutions including schools, PHCs, Anganwadi Centres etc. as possible. He should also inspect at least some of the works carried out/being carried out under various schemes like 14th FC, MNREGA and other government programmes. In case, there is a languishing project in the village, the officer should certainly inspect the same and record its progress.
- viii. In addition to all other activities that the visiting officer will carry out, he/she should lay special emphasis on 100% enrolment of school children (age 4-14 years), 100% coverage of PM-Kisan, Ayushman Bharat and 100% coverage of all beneficiary oriented schemes including pensions and scholarships. He/she should also try to understand how various government programmes can be better used for doubling rural incomes and energising small/micro enterprises and village industries.
- ix. The visiting officer shall restrain himself/herself from giving or offering any commitment on behalf of the government.
- x. The visiting officer shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues. As far as possible, his observations should be based on a contextual view emerging from his interactions in the village.
- xi. The report of the visiting officer shall be submitted both physically and electronically in the pre-circulated format. The officer should exercise all care and objectivity while filling up the same.
- xii. After completing the village visit and before leaving the district, the officer must hold a debriefing meeting with the Deputy Commissioner and his/her team and deposit the B2V2 booklets and any other lists/applications/grievances that may have been handed over to him/her during the visit.

Suggested Activity Schedule for the Visiting Officer

Pre and Post Visit Activities

- Meeting with the Deputy Commissioner for collection of documents and briefing regarding the visit before going to the Panchayat.
- Debriefing meeting with the Deputy Commissioner and submission of one copy of the filled-in booklet and other papers before leaving the district.

Day 1

- Arrival in the Panchayat by 10 A.M. (capture picture).
- Attend the Gram Sabha.
 - Hand out the charter of Fundamental Duties.
 - Discuss B2V1 report card, critical gap analysis report and obtain feedback on follow up of B2V1 activities.
 - Unveil the GPOD booklet in the Gram Sabha.
 - Get the resolution for approval of GPOD and MNREGA passed in the Gram Sabha.
 - Unveil the MPPC plan booklet in the Gram Sabha.
 - Inspect the four main blocks- 14P, MDM, ICDS, Chen Resources.
 - Check the purchase record register for MDM and ICDS.
 - Distribute the information flyers on Individual Beneficiary Based Schemes.
 - Fill up those columns of the B2V2 booklet which require Gram Sabha responses.
 - Distribute guidelines of government schemes which can help increase rural incomes e.g. Backyard Poultry, Dairy Entrepreneurship Scheme etc.
 - Get the Panchayat Biodiversity Committees constituted if not already constituted through a Panchayat (not Gram Sabha) resolution. The format for the resolution will be made available by the district administration.
 - Check Panchayat Asset register and Infrastructure register. If the same is not available, the officer will get it prepared.

- Collect copy of Panchayat Plastic Collection and Disposal plan.
- Get scheme-wise list of individuals who are desirous of availing individual beneficiary oriented schemes but have not applied so far.
- Collect any complaint/grievance that people may have, especially with regard to non-implementation of benefits under individual beneficiary oriented schemes.
- Get list of households without proper water-electricity connection.

Day 1 Activities:

- Visit local schools, health institutions, AWCs, government offices, banks, water bodies, kisan, electric station, important private enterprises.
- Visit other villages in the Panchayat.
- Evening informal interaction with Panchayat representatives, frontline government functionaries and government agencies to discuss and deliberate upon the core problems/issues being faced by the people of the Gram Panchayat and ways to increase rural incomes and energies/vigourous initiatives.
- Capture evening interaction picture by 8 (8) P.M.

Day 2:

- Capture morning picture at 7 A.M.
- Formal meeting with the Panchayat members
 - Get various sub-substitutions assigned to the persons by the Sarpanch if not already assigned and get a Panchayat resolution passed for the same.
 - Inspect the Karmik register and make the Panchayat members aware about the requirement of monthly meetings as per the Act.
 - Check the digital signatures of Sarpanch/Panchayat Secretary/Administrator.
 - Assess the functionality of Panchayats and discuss the difficulties being faced by the Panchayat in carrying out its functions and development works.
- Formal interaction with
 - Frontline government functionaries (Doctor/Teacher/Police/Anganwadi Workers/AHAs/ASHAs/WIFD, storekeepers/representatives of PHE, PWD, PWD, Agriculture, Animal Sheep, Horticulture etc.)
 - Social activists/NGOs.
 - Prominent citizens/retired teachers/Govt. employees/academicians etc.




