- Panchayat ghat is required and at present is in rented building.
- Most importantly people have no knowledge of individual beneficiary schemes and awareness camps need to be organised on a wide scale and frequently to ensure coverage and transmission of benefits.

2. There issues during B2.V1, B2.V2 which they have raised and also passed through visiting officers who were assigned by the authorities for the purpose but issues were not addressed timely.
3. Residents of Lower Mathar have complaint of non-availability of drinking water, pipes and water connection and also electric poles to be installed in requisite sites.
4. Illegal mining in Bismah nullah in w.No 1 at bye Patal nullah on a rampant scale and Plastic dumping in Bismah nullah at bye pass has been observed during visit of the area on spot.
5. People are very annoyed at w.No 6 regarding their land use using for defense/security purpose, people are not willing because their livelihood is completely depended upon their agriculture.

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
