Urgent public requirements in order of priority (Max. 07):

1. Lift irrigation project should be made fully functional. It irrigates only 200 acres land but Capacity is 5000 acres. It needs new pumps & drilling every year. Great losses, family function got lost. Damaged. Crops, roads, bridges & water. In 1981, it was made.
2. Installation of new pipes of diameter 6" for replacing old and damaged pipes. Two tube wells, two bore pumps require for fulfilling requirement of drinking water.
3. Removal/upgrade of cremation ground with bath facility. Laying down pipe roads for going cremation site.
4. Public Health Centre at Agore bus stop. Private school at Agore with 6 students should be closed with Agnashy. High school at this primary land should be used for Health Centre.
5. Urgent need of drain (Nallah) from Agore Chowk to river. Churn Thakur Chowk to solve the houses and shops for flooding of rain water.
6. Restoration, upgradation and repair of internal road throughout the Panchayat area.
7. Fair price shop, school in the Panchayat gram, separate fund share allotment, No transfer of FC fund B2V programme. Separate fund request for B2V schemes.
8. Poor condition of GHS Rampur. No room for students.

Any major complaint brought to notice of the Visiting Officer.

Poor transport facility. No transport available 11:00 am to 8:00 am or after 6:00 pm. Loosened electric wiring. No poles. Voltage fluctuations. Life threatening electric facility. No playground in Panchayat. Maintenance of Pond is near to house. No tube well for drinking water. No functioning in health, a road 2 rods from house upto house of Ashok Ram. No line in road 3 rods from house. No toilet at Agore bus stop. No lane at road 4 of Ramlal Chatterjee house, ~~no lane~~ no lane in Ramlal with. No road in 10th Channi. Much deficiency of road in Mohan Rajan. Delay in drinking water supply. Poor lane in Moh. Channi.

Government is doing well. Number of good schemes have been started. Generally funds are released in delayed manner. Higher authority/officers should visit the panchayat. MGNREGS payments are delayed.

Sufficient and timely funds should be released. Tourism spots near river chinal should be developed to improve the economic condition. Public darbar should be there on regular basis.
