I) GENERAL ASSESSMENT OF THE VISITING OFFICER:

Any major complaint brought to the notice of the Visiting Officer:

I Major Complaint is regarding power development left regarding irregular power supply and replacement of wooden electric poles with concrete poles. The inhabitants demand immediate redressal of problems identified during previous Back-to-Village programmes.

II Major/ urgent public demand(s) that was/were reflected earlier but have not been addressed so far:

1. Establishment/ of Revenue Complex at Rooham Construction
2. Upgradation in the power supply distribution network
3. Water Reservoirs Tank (20,000 Gallon)
4. Establishment of Sub-District Magistrate office.
5. Establishment of Police Station at Roohama.
7. Concrete boundary wall of G. High Sch. School, Rooham

III Overall assessment of visit and suggestions:

As far as B2V3 is concerned, There was a cold response from the inhabitants of the Halqa due to the non-execution of works identified/ approved during B2V1 & B2V2. The works approved/ identified during previous Back to Village programmes should be executed as early as possible, so that the objective of the mission is achieved. Most of the departments actively participate in the B2V3 programme. However, There has been a cold response from the Department of PWD (R & B) and PHE. It has been observed that the efforts put forth by Asha Workers & Anganwadi workers in safeguarding the health & nutrition of women & children is commendable.
