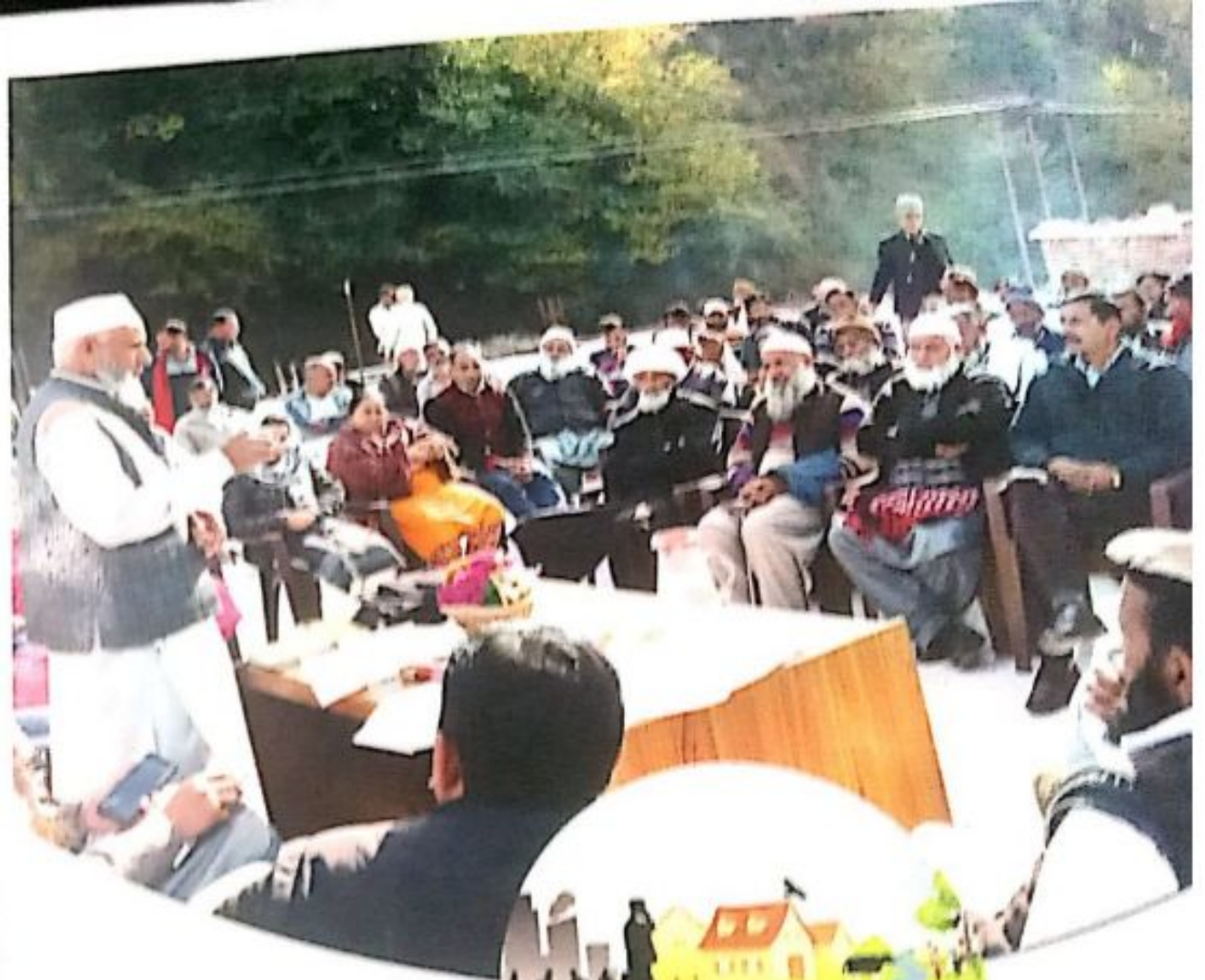

Message

I am delighted to learn that the 3rd version of the much acclaimed *Back to Village-3 (B2V3)* programme, a unique and ambitious exercise of taking government to the doorstep of people is being organized from 27th to 12th October 2020, across Jammu & Kashmir.

In June 2019, the Government of Jammu and Kashmir embarked on the *Back to Village* programme, which involved the visit of over 4000 Gazetted officers of J&K to every Panchayat and spending two days and a night there. It was also an opportunity to support and strengthen the newly constituted Panchayats. The programme was a huge success. Visiting officers were welcomed and fed by populace eager to share its troubles and travails with what they had perceived as an unresponsive administration. In fact such was the enthusiasm generated by the programme that the Hon'ble Prime Minister made a mention of it in his "Man Ki Baat", calling it "a festival of development, public participation and public awareness."

Encouraged by the success of the programme, the government organized the *Back to Village-2 (B2V2)* in November 2019. This time the focus was on ensuring that funds and functions devolved to the Panchayats were used without any bottlenecks and that beneficiary oriented schemes actually reach the last person in the queue. The Hon'ble Prime Minister again made mention of the programme in his Independence Day speech of 2020.

I believe the upcoming version of the *Back to Village-3 (B2V3)* programme will be an attempt at a concentrated and determined developmental push in the region. The actual programme shall be preceded by a three week Jan Abhiyan (*Awami Muhim*) which shall focus on 3 concurrent and interconnected goals: Jan Suruwai (*Awami Suruwai*) - Public grievances redressal, Adhikar Abhiyan (*Muhim Barai-e-Haqooq*) - Public Service Delivery and Ummat Gram Abhiyan (*Dafa Taraqqiyati Muhim*) - Delivery of Development on ground.

I am confident that this unique effort shall earn the respect of the people of Jammu and Kashmir and that it will be remembered for long as a unique and sincere effort of the government to reach the doorsteps of the people.

Message

James and Kashora continued to address a transformation of Panchayat Raj institutions and their constitution in 2014. Through the top of its next initiative - Back to Village - and the government's decision of integrating Land, Income and Environment in PRA, great multi-dimension has been added to the vision. Back to Village is a new step in this direction. The theme of the Back to Village programme I is being held from 2nd October to 12th October, 2015, which will give a deeper push to the institutionalisation of PRA.

While the first B2V focused on interaction and information on local needs, the second B2V focused on strengthening and institutionalising Panchayats, handholding the newly elected PRA and focusing on saturation and 100% coverage of individual beneficiaries' interest activities.

Now, building on the foundation set by B2V1 and B2V2, the B2V3 has been planned as an action edition with its focus on implementation and execution. This edition will aim to address grievances and needs by concrete action on the ground, thus making it more authentic and action-packed.

Further, local demands are being taken up through a three week long public outreach exercise - APNAR-Karnam Mahan, with its three concurrent and interconnected goals of public grievances redressal, public service delivery and delivery of development on ground. B2V3 is also in tune with the state government functioning and service delivery through an unprecedented proactive Government PRA interface.

Support to Panchayat representatives as well as people to come forward and proactively participate in the program, thereby making governance more participatory, transparent and responsive.

I also urge the Deputy Commissioners to coordinate the visits of officers to various Panchayat Rajes for better outcomes and ensure adherence to CCND SOPs while arranging various outreach activities.

I am confident that the people and officers alike will once again rise to the occasion and replicate the success of earlier B2V programmes.

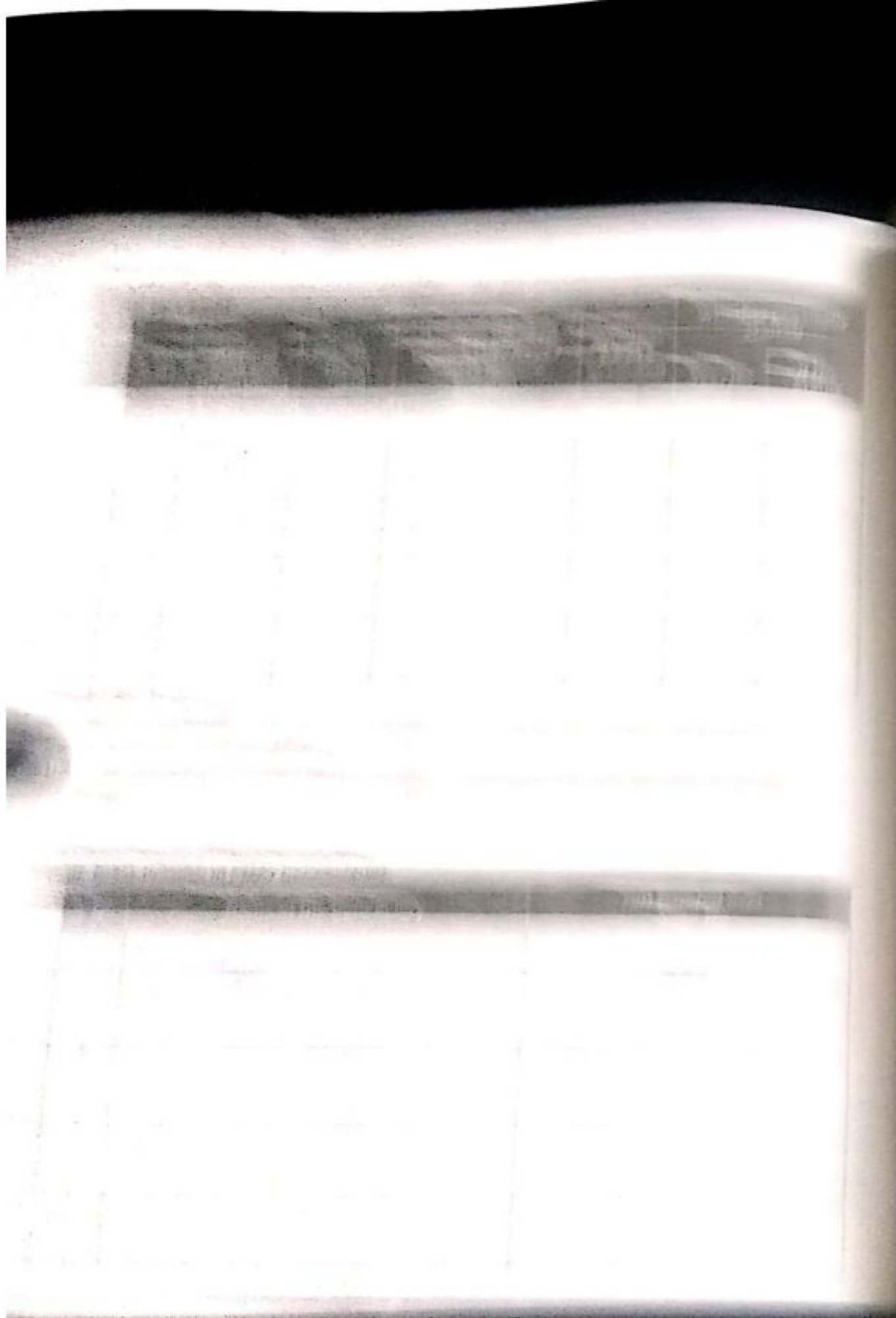
