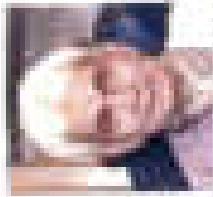

Message

I am delighted to learn that the 3rd session of the much-awaited Joint is village & family programme, a unique and ambitious exercise of taking Government to the doorstep of people is being organised from 2nd to 12th October next across Jammu & Kashmir.

In June 2015, the Government of Jammu and Kashmir introduced an 800 crore Joint programme which involved the aid of over 4000 Government officers at the local, family and spending two days and a night there. It was also an opportunity to connect and strengthen the newly constituted Panchayats. The programme was a huge success. Working officers were unbothered and aided by previous steps to share 50 villages and family with which they had performed an administrative responsibility. In fact such was the enthusiasm generated by the programme that the Hon'ble Prime Minister made a mention of it in his 'man in blue', calling it 'a behest of development, public participation and social awareness'.

Encouraged by the success of the programme, the Government organised the 2000 crore Village & Family programme in September 2016. This time the focus was on ensuring that funds and Government officers that Panchayats were used effectively. Panchayats received a monetary award to reward actively reach the last person in the village. The Hon'ble Prime Minister again made a mention of the programme in his Independence Day speech of 2016.

During the upcoming session of the Joint is Village & Family programme which is being organised and delivered by Government officers in the region. The Joint is programme shall be preceded by a three-week pre-activity through which shall focus on a conference and stakeholder group. An awareness session through public speakers, officials, village leaders (the Joint is Village & Family) and Government officers will ensure Government's commitment to the programme in the region.

I am confident that this unique effort shall earn the respect of the people of Jammu and Kashmir and that it will be remembered for long as a unique and lasting effort of the Government to reach the doorstep of the people.

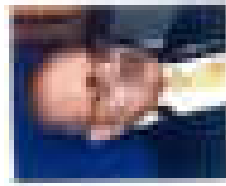
