Also, if during a particular B2V programme the locals are seriously assured about a particular project & action taken regarding it in the subsequent months, it might help in trust building viz-a-viz such programmes.

34 While assessing the funds for a particular work, the important thing to take into the consideration is the quality of the work. Many a times work is carried out, the project completed but it does not benefit the public for long for want of the quality of said work e.g. road, sanitary complexes, wall etc.

The coordination b/w diff departments is of utmost importance. A particular work is carried by a department, (say fencing or sanitary complex), after some time the other department carries their work ^(e.g. road) destroying / malfunctioning the previous work of other department. Although on paper, two departments completed their work, but on ground people continue to suffer.
