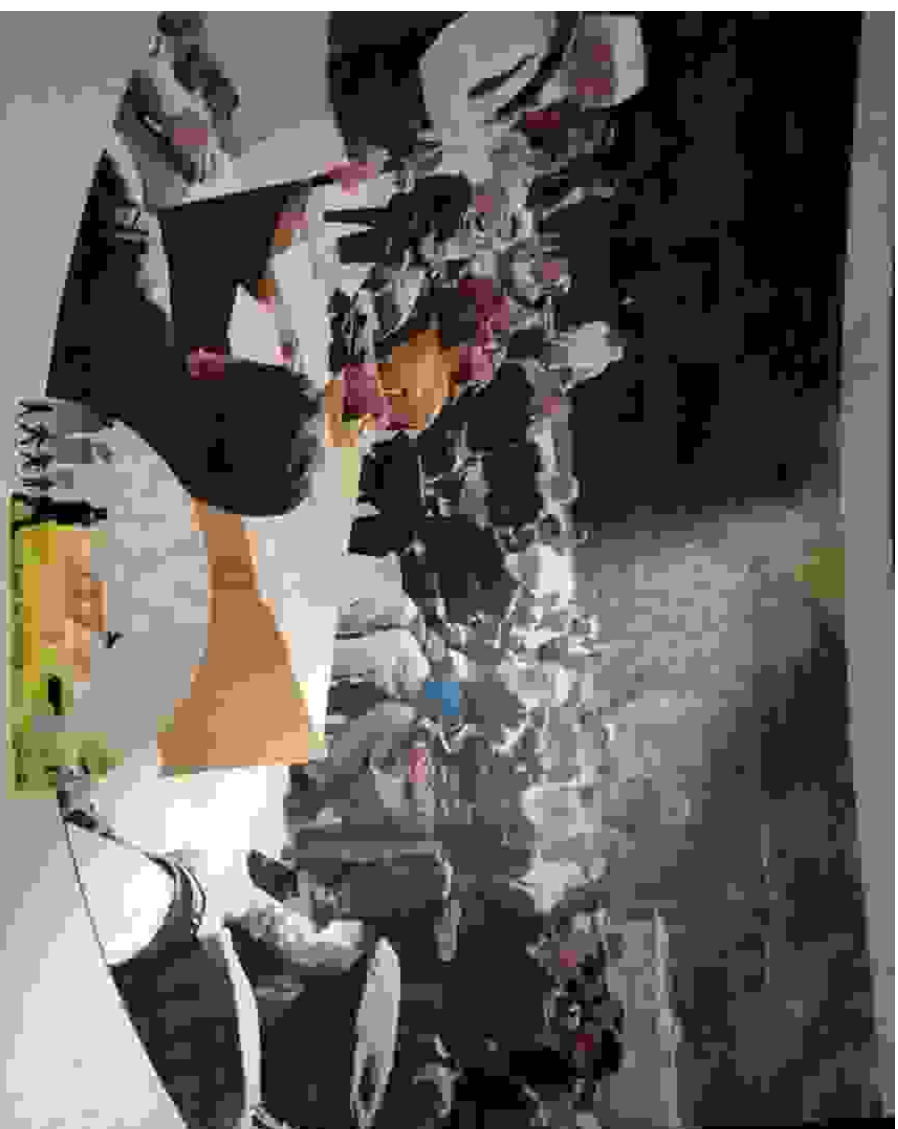

Jacques Derrida, the French philosopher, linguist, and literary critic, died on October 19, 2004. Derrida was born in 1929 in El Asnam, Algeria, and moved to France in 1949. He studied at the University of Algiers and then at the University of Paris, where he was a member of the École Normale Supérieure. He is best known for his work on deconstruction, a philosophical method that challenges the binary oppositions and hierarchical structures of Western thought. His most influential book, *Of Grammatology*, was published in 1967. Other notable works include *The Structure of Meaning* (1968), *Speech and Phenomena* (1968), *Writing and Difference* (1967), and *The Gift of Death* (1996). Derrida's work has had a profound impact on contemporary philosophy, literature, and cultural studies.
