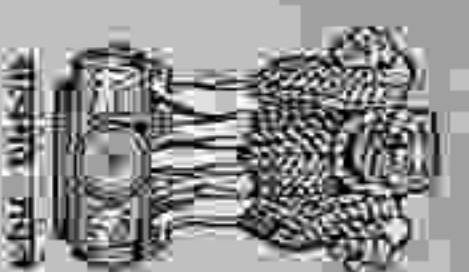

Message

I am delighted to learn that the 3rd version of the much-acclaimed *Back to Village-3 (B2V3)* programme, a unique and ambitious exercise of taking government to the doorstep of people is being organized from 2nd to 12th October 2020, across Jammu & Kashmir.

In June 2019, the Government of Jammu and Kashmir embarked on the *Back to Village* programme, which involved the visit of over 4000 Gazetted officers of J&K to every Panchayat and spending two days and a night there. It was also an opportunity to support and strengthen the newly constituted Panchayats. The programme was a huge success. Visiting officers were welcomed and feted by populace eager to share its troubles and travails with what they had perceived as an unresponsive administration. In fact such was the enthusiasm generated by the programme that the Hon'ble Prime Minister made a mention of it in his "Man Ki Baat" calling it "a festival of development, public participation and public awareness".

Encouraged by the success of the programme, the government organized the *Back to Village-2 (B2V2)* in November 2019. This time the focus was on ensuring that funds and functions devolved to the Panchayats were used without any bottlenecks and that beneficiary oriented schemes actually reach the last person in the queue. The Hon'ble Prime Minister again made mention of the programme in his Independence Day speech of 2020.

I believe the upcoming version of the *Back to Village-3 (B2V3)* programme will be an attempt at a concentrated and determined developmental push in the region. The actual programme shall be preceded by a three week Jan Abhiyan (Awami Muhim) which shall focus on 3 concurrent and interconnected goals: Jan Sahywal (Awami Surwai) - Public grievances redressal, Adhikar Abhiyan (Muhim Bara-e-Haqooq) - Public Service Delivery and Unnati Gram Abhiyan (Deh Taraqiyati Muhim) - Delivery of Development on ground.

I am confident that this unique effort shall earn the respect of the people of Jammu and Kashmir and that it will be remembered for long as a unique and sincere effort of the government to reach the doorsteps of the people.

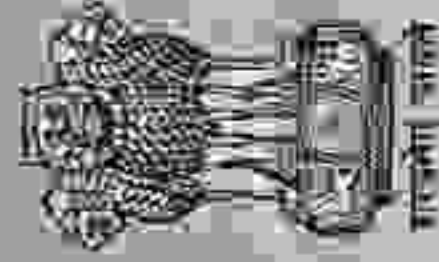

Message

Jammu and Kashmir continues to witness a transformation of Panchayat Raj institutions ever since their constitution in 2001. Through the first of its kind initiative – Back to Village – and the Government's decision of delegating funds, functions and functionalities to PRA, grass root democracy has flourished in the Union Territory as a next step in this direction. The phrase 'Back to Village' programme is being initiated from and October to 12th October 2020 which will give a deeper push to the institutionalization of PRIs.

While the first B2V focussed on interaction and information on local needs, the second B2V focussed on strengthening and institutionalizing Panchayats, handholding the newly elected PRIs and focusing on saturation and 100% coverage of individual beneficiary oriented schemes.

Now building on the foundation laid by B2V1 and B2V2, the B2V3 has been planned as an Action edition with its focus on implementation and execution. This edition will aim to address grievances and needs by concrete action on the ground, thus making it more ambitious and action packed.

Further local demands are being taken up through a three week long public outreach exercise-Jan Agniyan/Awami Muhim with its three concurrent and interconnected goals of public grievances redressal, public service delivery and delivery of development on ground. B2V3 is also an occasion to assess government functioning and service delivery through an unprecedented proactive Government-PRIs Interface.

I appeal to all Panchayat representatives as well as people to come forward and proactively participate in the program thereby making governance more participatory, transparent and responsive.

I also urge the Deputy Commissioners to coordinate the visits of officers to various Panchayat Halls for better outcomes and ensure adherence to COVID SOPs while arranging various outreach activities.

I am confident that the people and officials alike will once again rise to the occasion and make the success of earlier B2V programmes.

General instructions for the Visiting Officer

01. The visiting officer shall hold a meeting with the Deputy Commissioner of the district before undertaking the village visit. During this meeting, he/she shall be briefed about the action taken by the district regarding previous Back to Village visits. He/she shall collect a detailed action taken report of the wards/ issues/ problems/ grievances of the previous Back to Village visits. He/she shall also be briefed about and given data/ information regarding the activities related to his/ her Panchayat which were undertaken during the Jan Abhiyan/ Awami Muhim phase.
02. He/she shall collect his booklet from Deputy Commissioner's office in which several fields have been marked with asterisks (*). These fields are to be pre-filled by the district team. The visiting officer must check that the same has been done.
03. He/she shall also collect the draft MGNREGA and 15th FC plan, list of Awas beneficiaries, list of pension beneficiaries and Panchayat newsletter from the Deputy Commissioner's office.
04. A suggested activity schedule has been prepared for the visiting officer. It shall be incumbent on the officer to ensure that all activities and elements mentioned in the schedule are carried out/ covered fully.
05. The visiting officer should try and visit as many local institutions including schools, PHCs, Angwanwari centres, etc. as possible. He/she should prepare a small report on whether any improvement has been noted or any problem/ issue raised by the people regarding the same has been redressed or not.
06. He/she should visit all the wards of the Panchayat and participate in the Ward Sabhas, record the proceedings of the same and handover details of the issues raised and resolution passed if any to the Deputy Commissioner on his return. He/she shall hold meeting with BDC members, Panchayat members and prominent members of gram Panchayat and submit the details of the issues raised to the Deputy Commissioner. He/she shall also hold informal discussions with the residents of the Panchayat and assess the level of functionality of the Panchayat, infrastructure available, the reach of the government programmes and the satisfaction level of the people with various activities including the Jan Abhiyan/ Awami Muhim programme.
07. The officer shall attend the Gram Sabha in which the Gram Sabha passes the draft MGNREGA and 15th FC plan with or without changes. A detailed resolution regarding the same be prepared and handed over to the Deputy Commissioner on return. He/she should also read out the list of Awas beneficiaries and pension beneficiaries in the Gram Sabha and ensure reading out of any ineligible/ dead/ migrated beneficiaries. The list regarding these details should be handed over to the Deputy Commissioner's office.

Jan Abhiyan

September 10-30, 2020

The visiting officer shall participate in Poshan Abhiyan and Covid awareness or any other health related activity in the Gram Sabha. He/she shall distribute the Panchayat newsletter, the proceedings of Gram Sabha shall be recorded and hand over the copy of the resolution passed to the Deputy Commissioner's office.

The visiting officer shall also take part in the cultural/ sports activities organized in the Panchayat and distribute sports kits, certificates, education kits, scholarships, bicycles, bicycles, prosthetic kits, universal health cards, Ayushman gold cards or any other distribution scheme. Insure district administration has arranged for.

The visiting officer shall also start any one water conservation work in the Panchayat. He/she shall support and facilitate in identifying economically weaker families and frame a plan for their upliftment by inter alia taking advantage of various schemes in the government. The visiting officer while filling the booklet shall make a fair assessment of functionality of the Panchayat body and the impact of and response of people to Jan Abhiyan/ Awami Munnim. If felt necessary, he/she can submit a separate report regarding the same to the Deputy Commissioner.

He/she shall also make specific effort to identify any pendency in the schemes/ benefits in which 100% saturation has been targeted during Jan Abhiyan/ Awami Munnim and shall try to make an analysis of genuineness or otherwise of reasons for this pendency. The pendency and the reasons shall be brought to the notice of the Deputy Commissioner by the visiting officer.

The visiting officer shall also participate in the mega melas/ IEC activity of different departments, attend Mahila Sabha and Bal Sabha, inaugurate and lay foundation stone of any works and take part in the Griha Pravesh ceremonies at houses completed under PMAY. After completing the village visit and before leaving the district, the officer must hold a debriefing meeting with the Deputy Commissioner/ his/her team. The officer shall deposit the B2V3 booklet and other documents as mentioned above along with any other list/ reports that he/she may submit to the DC and his/her team.

The visiting officer shall refrain himself/ herself from offering any commitment at the government and shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues. As far as possible his/her observation should be based on a fair and analytical view emerging from his/her interaction in the village.

The PPI members (Sarpanchs, Panchs, BDC Chairperson) shall be kept at the forefront at all activities and given due importance and the approach should be to ensure they listen and make them feel empowered. He/she shall ensure that the BDC chairperson and Sarpanch/ Panch are present at the time of inauguration and ceremonies.

The visiting officer shall also validate the Mission Antyodaya form and ease of doing survey data in the gram sabha.

The visiting officer shall ensure that COVID protocols are strictly followed during the visits.
