

## Message

I am delighted to learn that the 3<sup>rd</sup> version of the much-acclaimed Back-to-Village-3 (B2V3) programme, a unique and ambitious exercise of taking government to the doorstep of people is being organized from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> October 2020 across Jammu & Kashmir. In June 2019, the Government of Jammu and Kashmir embarked on the Back-to-village programme, which involved the visit of over 4000 Gazetted officers of JSK to every Panchayat and spending two days and a night there. It was also an opportunity to support and strengthen the newly constituted Panchayats. The programme was a huge success. Visiting officers were welcomed and feted by populace, eager to share its troubles and travails with what they had perceived as an unresponsive administration. In fact such was the enthusiasm generated by the programme that the Hon'ble Prime Minister made a mention of it in his "Man Ki Baat", calling it "a festival of development, public participation and public awareness".


Encouraged by the success of the programme, the government organized the Back-to-village-2 (B2V2) in November 2019. This time the focus was on ensuring that funds and functions devolved to the Panchayats were used without any bottlenecks and that beneficiary-oriented schemes actually reach the last person in the queue. The Hon'ble Prime Minister again made mention of the programme in his Independence Day speech of 2020.

I believe the upcoming version of the Back-to-Village-3 (B2V3) programme will be an attempt at a concentrated and determined developmental push in the region. The actual programme shall be preceded by a three week Jan Abhiyan (Awami Muhimm) which shall focus on 3 concurrent and interconnected goals: Jan Sunwai (Awami Sunwai) - Public grievances redressal, Adhikar Abhiyan (Muhami Bara-e-Haqooq) - Public Service Delivery and Unnati Gram Abhiyan (Dehi Tarraqiyati Muhami) - Delivery of Development on ground.

I am confident that this unique effort shall earn the respect of the people of Jammu and Kashmir and that it will be remembered for long as a unique and sincere effort of the government to reach the doorssteps of the people.

## Message

Jammu and Kashmir continues to witness a transition "Vasav" of Ranbir Singh Raj (Ranbir Singh) since their assumption in 2019. Through the first of us nine initiatives - Back to Village - and the Government's decision of segregating funds, Jumtore and Uniatore to PRR, greater democracy has flourished in the Union Territory as a next step. B2V3 also in measure to assess government functioning and service delivery through an unprecedented innovative Government-PRIs Interface.

I appeal to all Panchayat representatives as well as people to come forward and proactively participate in the program thereby making governments more participatory. I am patient and responsive.

I also urge the Deputy Commissioners to coordinate the visits of officers to various Panchayat Halqas for better outcomes and adherence to COVID guidelines while advancing various social activities.

I am confident that the people and officials alike will give their best to make this third initiative a success. I thank B2V programmes.

## General Instructions for the Visiting Officer

01. The visiting officer shall hold a meeting with the Deputy Commissioner of the district about the action taken by the district regarding previous Back to Village visits. They shall collect a detailed action taken report of the visitors' issues/problems and given data/information regarding the activities related to her/his Panchayat which were undertaken during the Jan Abhiyan/Awami Muhim phase.
02. He/she shall collect his booklet from Deputy Commissioner's office in which several fields have been marked with asterisks (\*). These fields are to be pre-filled by the district team. The visiting officer must check that the same has been done.
03. He/she shall also collect the draft MGNREGA and 18<sup>th</sup> FC plan, list of Awas beneficiaries' list of pension beneficiaries and Panchayat newsletter from the Deputy Commissioner's office.
04. A suggested activity schedule has been prepared for the visiting officer. It shall be incumbent on the officer to ensure that all activities and elements mentioned in the schedule are carried out/covered fully.
05. The visiting officer should try and visit as many local institutions including schools, PHCs, Angwanwari centres, etc. as possible. He/she should prepare a small report on whether any improvement has been noted or any problem/issue raised by the people regarding the same has been redressed or not.
06. He/she should visit all the wards of the Panchayat and participate in the Ward Sabhas, record the proceedings of the sams and Handpoyer details of the issues raised and resolution passed if any to the Deputy Commissioner on his return. He/she shall hold meeting with BDC members, Panchayat members and prominent members of Gram Panchayat and submit the details of the issues raised to the Deputy Commissioner. He/she shall also hold informal discussions with the residents of the Panchayat and assess the level of functionality of the Panchayat infrastructure available, the reach of the government programmes and the satisfaction level of the people with various activities including the Jan Abhiyan/ Awami Muhim programme.
07. The officer shall attend the Gram Sabha in which the Gram Sabha passes the draft MGNREGA and 18<sup>th</sup> FC plan with or without changes. A detailed resolution regarding the same will be prepared and handed over to the Deputy Commissioner on return. He/she should also read out the list of sams, beneficiaries and pension beneficiaries in the Gram Sabha and ensure 'meeting roll' of any ineligible/ dead/ migrated beneficiaries. The list regarding these donee cases should be handed over to the Deputy Commissioner's office.

## **Schedule for the Visiting Officer**

15. The office in Panchayat in position Abhiyan unit/Devt. awareness or any other unit of abhiyan committee Sathu hez/she shall distribute the Janchayak form to her. The concerned officer shall be recorded and handed over to the concerned officer in the Deputy Commissioner's office.

16. Every Jangam shall also work in the cultural / sports activities organized in the Panchayat and distribute sports kits, education kits, scholarships, incentives. They shall proactively administer universal health cards Ayushman gold cards or any other card issued by the concerned administration.

17. The visiting officer shall also visit any one water conservation work in the Panchayat he/she shall inspect and facilitate identifying economically weaker families and income & plan for their development by inter alia taking advantage of various schemes in the movement. The visiting officer while filling the booklet shall make a fair assessment of financially weaker families and the impact of and response of people to JanAbhiyan/ Awareness Munnur. If felt necessary he/she can submit a separate report regarding the same to the Deputy Commissioner.

18. He/she shall also make specific effort to identify any pendingency in these schemes/ benefits in which local saturation has been targeted during Jan Abhiyan/ Awareness and shall try to make an analysis of genuineness or otherwise of reasons for this pendingency. The pendingency and the reasons shall be brought to the notice of the Deputy Commissioner by the visiting officer.

19. The visiting officer shall also participate in the mega mela/ IEC activity of different departments, annual Manla Sabha and BaulSabhas, inaugurate and lay foundation stone of any works and take part in the Githa Pravesh ceremonies at houses Empowered under PMAY after completing the village visit and before leaving the district the officer must hold a debriefing meeting with the Deputy Commissioner. His/her team/ This officer shall deposit the B2V3 Booklet and other documents as mentioned above along with any other list/ reports that may be made available to the DC and his/her team.

20. The visiting officer shall introduce himself/giving offering any commitment at the government and shall accept an unbiased attitude in reporting issues. As far as possible his/her observation should be based on a fair and analytical view bringing like his/her interaction in the village.

21. The Panchayat members (Sarpanch, Panchayat Chairman/person) shall be kept at the concerned office and shall be informed about the concerned officer and make them feel empowered. He/She shall ensure that the concerned officer and concerned Panchayat are present at the time of inauguration meeting.

22. The visiting officer should also validate the Mission Activity/Daya form and ease of living condition in the community.

23. The visiting officer shall ensure that COVID protocols are strictly followed during the visits.
