1. Reaction of Alkyl Halides

Alkyl halides are organic compounds in which a halogen atom is bonded to a carbon atom of an alkyl group.

They are classified into primary, secondary, and tertiary alkyl halides based on the number of alkyl groups attached to the carbon atom bonded to the halogen.

Primary alkyl halides: $R-CH_2-X$

Secondary alkyl halides: R_2CH-X

Tertiary alkyl halides: R_3C-X

Reaction of Alkyl Halides

1. Substitution Reaction

Alkyl halides undergo substitution reactions where the halogen atom is replaced by another atom or group.

Example: $R-X + OH^- \rightarrow R-OH + X^-$

2. Elimination Reaction

Alkyl halides undergo elimination reactions where a halogen atom and an adjacent hydrogen atom are removed, forming a double bond.

Example: $R-CH_2-CH_2-X + OH^- \rightarrow R-CH=CH_2 + X^- + H_2O$

3. Free Radical Reaction

Alkyl halides undergo free radical reactions where the halogen atom is removed, forming a free radical.

Example: $R-X \xrightarrow{h\nu} R\cdot + X\cdot$

4. Grignard Reaction

Alkyl halides react with magnesium metal to form Grignard reagents.

Example: $R-X + Mg \rightarrow R-Mg-X$
