 - Ⓑ Voltage problems: due to large area few transformers cannot pick up load of more than 1400 house holds.
 - Ⓒ Education problems: worse condition of school buildings as high school is for a children have to walk more than 5km to reach nearest high school.
 - Ⓓ Health problems: only one clinic at one corner of panchayat & for many ailments or essential need women especially pregnant women have to walk more than 5km to CHC with their children for same purpose.
 - Ⓔ Drinking water problems: more than 70% of houses are without tap water facility & women have to walk/travel more than 1km to nearest source for same.
- Major urgent public demands that were being affecting people but have not been addressed so far
 - Ⓐ Sanction of more needed requirement & black topping of new roads.
 - Ⓑ Sanction of atleast 2-4 transformers of 15 KV and as per needs.
 - Ⓒ requirement of old building and sanction of additional classrooms in all schools and upgradation atleast one PLS and two PLS and sanction of two PLS.
 - Ⓓ Sanction of one PHC and two CHC in the panchayat.
 - Ⓔ Providing tap water facility & starting of two projects already sanctioned from Gramin Kumbhar to Khandharp and Khaditara to Mal Khandri.
 - Ⓕ Sanction of about 400 poles & one line of using from a nearby poles.
 - Ⓖ Sanctioning community health & welfare center.
