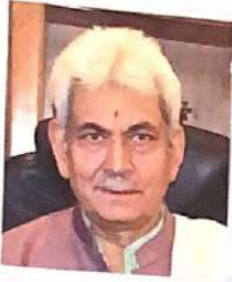

Message

I am delighted to learn that the 3rd version of the much-acclaimed *Back to Village-3 (B2V3)* programme, a unique and ambitious exercise of taking government to the doorstep of people is being organized from 2nd to 12th October 2020, across Jammu & Kashmir.

In June 2019, the Government of Jammu and Kashmir embarked on the *Back to Village* programme, which involved the visit of over 4000 Gazetted officers of J&K to every Panchayat and spending two days and a night there. It was also an opportunity to support and strengthen the newly constituted Panchayats. The programme was a huge success. Visiting officers were welcomed and feted by populace eager to share its troubles and travails with what they had perceived as an unresponsive administration. In fact such was the enthusiasm generated by the programme that the Hon'ble Prime Minister made a mention of it in his "Man Ki Baat", calling it "a festival of development, public participation and public awareness."

Encouraged by the success of the programme, the government organized the *Back to Village-2 (B2V2)* in November 2019. This time the focus was on ensuring that funds and functions devolved to the Panchayats were used without any bottlenecks and that beneficiary oriented schemes actually reach the last person in the queue. The Hon'ble Prime Minister again made mention of the programme in his Independence Day speech of 2020.

I believe the upcoming version of the *Back to Village-3 (B2V3)* programme will be an attempt at a concentrated and determined developmental push in the region. The actual programme shall be preceded by a three week Jan Abhiyan (Awami Muhim) which shall focus on 3 concurrent and interconnected goals: Jan Sunvwai (Awami Sunwai) - Public grievances redressal, Adhikar Abhiyan (Muhim Barai-e-Haqooq) - Public Service Delivery and Unnat Gram Abhiyan (Dehi Taraqiyati Muhim) - Delivery of Development on ground.

I am confident that this unique effort shall earn the respect of the people of Jammu and Kashmir and that it will be remembered for long as a unique and sincere effort of the government to reach the doorsteps of the people.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * All the departments except Agriculture and R.D.D are not cooperating properly particularly P.W.D., P.D.D, PHE, Social Forestry So. These indifference are responsible for the plight of village. * As the funds are not provided under back to village programme people consider it a futile exercise and wastage of time. So, if government wants fruitful results then the promises made in these programmes must be fulfilled. 	
II	Major/ urgent public demand(s) that was/were reflected earlier but have not been addressed so far:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * In both the previous programmes the demands of Primary Health Center and Veterinary clinic are put forward before the visiting officer but unfortunately both are still remained unfulfilled. * Panchayat also demanded better road connectivity. In this context they demanded two roads Chhan Aronban to Shawal and Chhan Aronban to Lawal. * One of these demands reflected in B2V2104. <u>the playground for younger generation is also not addressed.</u> 	
III	Overall assessment of visit and suggestions: (The visiting officer to ensure that the overall assessment is recorded in detail along with concrete suggestions.)
	<p><u>Overall Assessment</u> :</p> <p>After the three days visit of Panchayat Shawal one thing is clear that local people are facing so many problems including insufficient supply of drinking water, shortage of electric poles ^{back of playground}.</p> <p><u>Suggestion</u> :</p> <p>Problem of drinking water can be solved upto some extent by installing a motor, pumpset and transformer in a constructed tubewell at village Pandyan. In the same village a man is ready to provide ten katal of his land for the construction of playground for younger generation. This will solve the problem of playground. Another problem can be solved, if electric poles are directly provided.</p>
