Message

I am delighted to learn that the 3rd version of the much-acclaimed Back to Village-3 (B2V3) programme, a unique and ambitious exercise of taking government to the doorstep of people is being organized from 2nd to 12th October 2020, across Jammu & Kashmir.

In June 2019, the Government of Jammu and Kashmir embarked on the Back to Village programme, which involved the visit of over 4000 Gazetted officers of J&K to every Panchayat and spending two days and a night there. It was also an opportunity to support and strengthen the newly constituted Panchayats. The programme was a huge success. Visiting officers were welcomed and feted by populace eager to share its troubles and travails with what they had perceived as an unresponsive administration. In fact such was the enthusiasm generated by the programme that the Hon'ble Prime Minister made a mention of it in his "Man Ki Baat", calling it "a festival of development, public participation and public awareness".

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Encouraged by the success of the programme, the government organized the Back to Village-2 (B2V2) in November 2019. This time the focus was on ensuring that funds and functions devolved to the Panchayats were used without any bottlenecks and that beneficiary oriented schemes actually reach the last person in the queue. The Hon'ble Prime Minister again made mention of the programme in his Independence Day speech of 2020.


I believe the upcoming version of the Back to Village-3 (B2V3) programme will be an attempt at a concentrated and determined developmental push in the region. The actual programme shall be preceded by a three week Jan Abhiyan (Awami Muhim) which shall focus on 3 concurrent and interconnected goals: Jan Sunvwal (Awami Sunwal) - Public grievances redressal, Adhikar Abhiyan (Muham Barai-e-Haqooq) - Public Service Delivery and Unnat Gram Abhiyan (Dehi Taraqiyati Muham) - Delivery of Development on ground.

I am confident that this unique effort shall earn the respect of the people of Jammu and Kashmir and that it will be remembered for long as a unique and sincere effort of the government to reach the doorsteps of the people.

Message

Jammu and Kashmir continues to witness a transformation of Panchayati Raj Institutions ever since their constitution in 2018. Through the first of its kind initiative -'Back to Village'- and the Government's decision of delegating funds, functions and functionaries to PRIs, grass roots democracy has flourished in the Union Territory. As a next step in this direction, the phase 3 of the 'Back to Village' programme 3 is being held from 2nd October to 12th October, 2020, which will give a deeper push to the institutionalization of PRIs.

While the first B2V focussed on interaction and information on local needs, the second B2V focused on strengthening and institutionalizing Panchayats, handholding the newly elected PRIs and focusing on saturation and 100% coverage of individual beneficiary oriented schemes.

Now, building on the foundation laid by B2V1 and R2V2, the B2V3 has been planned as an 'Action' edition with its focus on implementation and execution. This edition will aim to address grievances and needs by concrete action on the ground, thus making it more ambitious and action packed.

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Further, local demands are being taken up through a three week long public outreach exercise-Jan Abhiyan/Awami Muhim, with its three concurrent and interconnected goals of public grievances redressal, public service delivery and delivery of development on ground. B2V3 is also an occasion to assess government functioning and service delivery through an unprecedented proactive Government-PRI interface.

I appeal to all Panchayat representatives as well as people to come forward and proactively participate in the program, thereby making governance more participatory, transparent and responsible.

I also urge the Deputy Commissioners to coordinate the visits of officers to various Panchayat Halgas for better outcomes and ensure adherence to COVID SOPs while arranging various outreach activities.

I am confident that the people and officials alike will once again rise to the occasion and replicate the success of earlier B2V programmes.


The matter of concern is that some villagers have occupied state land/grazing land nearer to village in lieu/exchange of their owned land like Nagrad along hillside. This amounts to about many hundred kanals. Some big guns of them are in possession of land at both places i.e., they have not surrendered at either place.

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In the discussion in the Gram Sabha I noticed that the Plans/Schemes drafted like Construction of Community hall, Playfield, Gram Panchayat building, Separate building for Health Care Center, Govt Primary School etc. drafted by the government officials will not go ahead so will be a distant dream. The schemes will remain confined to papers unless & until the people will not voluntarily surrender the usurped land or revenue deptt. comes into action.

The people of Hundura are pressing hard for their village to be declared as backward. They feel that their village is ignored at all fronts. They must be given a patient hearing.
