There are many opportunities for development of animal husbandry, horticulture, small scale projects, dairy farms, furniture generating factories, Tourism and residential. A large chunk of people is un-employed, there is enough labour/ manpower. So, if this manpower is used properly it could change fate of the soil. Road connectivity, water supply, electricity and health problems are major problems of this Panchayat. There is abundant water in area but mismanaged. There are no students in schools but lack of school buildings. By the areas of problems under section/discussion should be strengthened.

As a visiting officer (B2V3 Bhayan) I recommend the following plans/activities on priority basis as an extension instructions to my visits throughout Panchayat from 06.10.20 to 10.10.20.

- (i) The following plans have been passed at Panchayat Sangrahalaya:
 - W.No 1. two works, estimated cost (1.5 + 1.3) lakh = 2.8 lakh
 - W.No 2. two works, estimated cost (2.0 + 3.0 + 2.5 + 2.0) = 9.5 lakh
 - W.No 3. two works, estimated cost (5.0 + 2.5) = 7.5 lakh
 - W.No 4. two works, estimated cost (2.0 + 3.0) = 5.0 lakh
 - W.No 5. two works, estimated cost (3.0 + 3.0) = 6.0 lakh
 - W.No 6. three works, estimated cost (5.0 + 2.0 + 2.0) = 9.0 lakh
 - W.No 7. two works, estimated cost (2.0 + 5.0 + 5.0 + 11.5) = 23.5 lakh

(ii) There are seven wards in Panchayat. There are only four Anganwadi Centres. But three wards have one centre. These wards are W.No 1 (Dalla), W.No 3 (Jagal) and W.No 7 (Kashkood). So, three Anganwadi centres are highly recommended.

(iii) The Panchayat Sangrahalaya (lower-13) consists of only one revenue village but there are four Panchayats. So this Panchayat should be divided into revenue village. These maps should be drawn on the basis of geographical features not on political aims.

(iv) The revenue village Sangrahalaya is a far-flung and vast village. There are high bridges, hills, terrain, deep gorges. There is only one army road. The village needs road connectivity. It is highly recommended.

(v) The people of Kaila (Sangrahalaya) are living in acute scarcity of water. A water lift scheme under (BAPD) has been completed but not commissioned. It should be started on priority.

(vi) Mostly the people of Sangrahalaya are ethnic and residing in tough area (AIC). Some basic services i.e. water, electricity and health and road connectivity should be strengthened further on priority.
