





Programs in line of the needs and for filing cases in a short duration of time like 20 days of 30 working days of the MRP have been identified which include facts of highly poverty and unemployment among students of the village. Channel through whom students can be educated, various facilities should be there like kitchen, in view of the increasing age. The planning of the area has to be based on the basis of the opinion that capacity of the people per month available to the area for poverty should be along with local connectivity from poor centre towards to the area. It should be connected with other areas. This will help in reducing the cost of transport. But there are some areas which need to be connected to the road network regularly by government. Roads can be constructed to spread awareness regarding hygienic condition and also in the way of the area. Self Government and Gram Panchayat can play a vital role in running the MRP.
