## Message

I am delighted to learn that the 3<sup>rd</sup> version of the much-acclaimed *Back to Village-3 (B2V3)* programme, a unique and ambitious exercise of taking government to the doorstep of people is being organized from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> October 2020 across Jammu & Kashmir

In June 2019 the Government of Jammu and Kashmir embarked on the *Back to Village* programme which involved the visit of over 4000 Gazetted officers of J&K to every Panchayat and spending two days and a night there. It was also an opportunity to support and strengthen the newly constituted Panchayats. The programme was a huge success. Visiting officers were welcomed and feted by populace eager to share its troubles and travails with what they had perceived as an unresponsive administration. In fact such was the enthusiasm generated by the programme that the Hon'ble Prime Minister made a mention of it in his "Man Ki Baat", calling it "a festival of development, public participation and public awareness".

Encouraged by the success of the programme the government organized the *Back to Village-2 (B2V2)* in November 2019. This time the focus was on ensuring that funds and functions devolved to the Panchayats were used without any bottlenecks and that beneficiary oriented schemes actually reach the last person in the queue. The Hon'ble Prime Minister again made mention of the programme in his Independence Day speech of 2020.

I believe the upcoming version of the *Back to Village-3 (B2V3)* programme will be an attempt at a concentrated and determined developmental push in the region. The actual programme shall be preceded by a three week Jan Abhiyan (Awami Muhim) which shall focus on 3 concurrent and interconnected goals: Jan Sunvwai (Awami Sunwai) - Public grievances redressal, Adhikar Abhiyan (Muhim Barai-e-Haqooq) - Public Service Delivery and Unnat Gram Abhiyan (Dehi Taraqiya Muhim) - Delivery of Development on ground.

I am confident that this unique effort shall earn the respect of the people of Jammu and Kashmir and that it will be remembered for long as a unique and sincere effort of the government to reach the doorsteps of the people.

## Message

Jammu and Kashmir continues to witness a transformation of Panchayat Raj institutions ever since their constitution in 2003. Through the use of its initiative - 'Back to Village' and the Government's decision of delegating funds, functions and functionsaries to PPRs, grass roots democracy has flourished in the Union Territory. As a next step in this direction, the phase 3 of the 'Back to Village' programme is being held from 1st October to 20th October, 2020, which will give a deeper push to the institutionalisation of PPRs.

While the first BSV focussed on interaction and information on local needs, the second BSV focused on strengthening and institutionalising Panchayats, handholding the newly elected PPRs and focusing on saturation and 100% coverage of individual beneficiary oriented schemes.

Now building on the foundation laid by BSV1 and BSV2, the BSV3 has been planned as an action edition with its focus on implementation and execution. This edition will aim to address grievances and needs by concrete action on the ground, thus making it more ambitious and action packed.

Further, local demands are being taken up through a three week long public outreach exercise - Jan Aardram, Swasth Manav, with its three concurrent and inter-connected phases of public grievances redressal, public service delivery and delivery of development on ground. BSV3 is also an occasion to assess government functioning and service delivery through an unprecedented creative Government-PPR interface.

Representative Panchayat representatives as well as people income broadening measures participate in the program thereby making governance more democratic, transparent and accountable.

I also urge the District Commissioners to coordinate the visits of officers to various Panchayat Hq's for better outcomes and ensure adherence to COVID SOPs while emerging around outreach activities.

I am confident that the people and officials alike will once again rise to the occasion and redouble the success of earlier BSV programmes.
