GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. The visiting officer shall refrain himself/ herself giving or offering any commitment on behalf of the government and shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues. As far as possible, his/her observation should be based on a fair and analytical view emerging from his/her interaction in the village.
- 2. He is going to the village as planning officer, not for sanctioning any works or for making any commitments.
- 3. While preparing village development plan, he has to ensure that, demands are prioritized and reflected under available schemes, wherever necessary the larger works are to be referred to administrative deptt under CSS/UT plans under intimation to DCs and rest of the works to DCs for reflecting it under district/CSS plans
- 4. His work shall be hard core planning and audit and is not a PR exercise.
- 5. Every Deputy Commissioner has to ensure that atleast one RDD official (ideally Panchayat Secretary) is present in every panchayat with relevant panchayat records, to ensure conduct of all activities as planned. Panchayat wise order needs to be issued in advance.
- 6. Visiting officer should ideally carry his/her laptop to complete the reports at the panchayat level itself and upload the final report, duly signed both by the sarpanch and by the visiting officer on www.jkpanchayat.in portal, before they leave panchayat.
- 7. Focus of visit are youth, skills, self-employment, nasha mukt, bhrashtrachar mukt, Rozgar yukt J&K, besides to carry forward the activities during Jan Abhiyan and saturate them.



GENERAL ASSESSMENT OF THE VISTING OFFICER

I- Any major complaint brought to the notice of the Visiting Officer:

MAJOR COMPLAINT RECEIVED DURING MAHILA SABHA AND BAL SABHA WHICH ARE AS

DETAILED BELOW.

DURING MAHILA SABHA ALL THE WOMEN WITH A SINGLE VOICE TALKED ABOUT THE CONDITION OF NTPHC, THOUGH IT IS A NEWELY CONSTRUCTED BUILDING BUT WITH IN TWO YEARS IT HAS BEEN DETERIORATED A LOT, LACK OF BASIC EQUIPMENT AND LABORATORY IS THERE IN NTPHC, THERE IS KACHHA LINK ROAD OF 200 MTS FOR REACHING NTPHC EVEN NOT ENOUGH SUPPLY OF MEDICINE IS THERE.

DURING BAL SABHA THE POINTS PUT UP BY THE CHILDREN BEFORE THE VISITING OFFICER NOT ONLY SHOCKED HIM BUT LEFT HIM DUMBFOLDED, AND AFTER VISITING SCHOOL HE REALISED THAT IN THIS 21ST CENTURY WE ARE NOT EVEN ABLE TO PROVIDE THEM BASIC FACILITIES. GOVT. HIGH SCHOOL BARMANDAL HAS CLASSES UPTO 10TH AND THERE ARE CHILDRENS IN EVERY CLASS, BUT DUE TO LACK OF CLASS ROOMS TWO CLASSES ARE HELD IN ONE CLASS ROOM SIMULTANEOUSLY, NO PLAY GROUND IS THERE, THERE IS ICT LABORATORY BUT WITHOUT COMPUTER, SCHOOL BUILDING ALSO NEEDS REPAIR. WHAT TO SAY THE CONDITION OF GIRLS MIDDLE SCHOOL SELA IS EVEN WORSE, THERE ALSO TWO CLASSES ARE BEING HELD IN ONE CLASSROOM, EVEN THE STUDENTS ARE NOT PROVIDED DESKS AND THEY ARE MADE TO SIT ON MATS, EVEN THE SCHOOL DON'T HAVE WATER SUPPLY AND ELECTRICITY SUPPLY EITHER DUE TO NEGLIENCE OF DEPARTMENTS OR LACK OF FUNDS. THE VISITING OFFICER TOOK UP THE MATTER WITH PHE AND ELECTRICAL DEPARTMENT AND THEY ASSURED THAT ELECTRICITY AND WATER SUPPLY SHALL BE RESOLVED SHORTLY.

OVERALL THE INFRASTRUCTURE OF SCHOOLS IN PANCHAYAT BARMANDAL IS NOT AS PER GUIDELINES OR CHILDREN FRIENDLY.

CHILDRENS ALSO DEMANDED THE RENOVATION OF DEFUNCT CHILDREN PARK AND CONSTRUCTION OF PLAY GROUND IN EVERY SCHOOL AS THERE ARE NOT MUCH AVENUES FOR ENTERTAINMENT OF CHILDRENS.

REQUIREMENT OF ARTIFICAL LAKE REQUIREMENT OF AMBULANCE UPGRADATION OF HS TATTAPANI TO HIGHER SECONDARY REQUIREMENT OF J&K BANK MINI BRANCH ALONGWITH ATM BUILDING FOR PANCHAYAT GHAR REQUIREMENT OF CHILDREN PARK REQUIREMENT OF HAND PUMPS IN EACH WARD COMMUNITY HALL WITH SANITARY COMPLEX

III- Overall assessment of the visit and suggestions:

1. THIS IS A TOURIST DESTINATION PLACE DUE TO HOT WATER SPRING WHICH

BACK TO VILLAGE PHASE IV (15TH OCT TO 3RD NOVAL PROPERTIES SO THIS PLACE SHOULD BE





DEVELOPED FROM TOURISM POINT OF VIEW, EVEN NOW TOURIST FLOW IS THERE ESPECIALLY DURING WINTER SEASON, FOR THIS THE DEVOLMENT OF HOT WATER SPRING IS NECESSARY, ALSO THE DETAILED PROJECT REPORT OF ARTIFICAL LAKE AT TATTAPANI ALREADY STANDS PREPARED AND LIES WITH THE CONCERNED AUTHORITIES AS INFORMED BY THE SARPANCH. FOR DEVELOPING TOURIST HUB ROAD CONNECTIVITY NEEDS TO BE INCREASED AND FOR THAT NEW ROAD FROM DALLI TO TATAPANI VIA BERGALA AND RATTIAN PANOTI IS REQUIRED.

- 2. THE INCOMPLETE PROJECT OF FILTERATION PLANT AT KERI BEING EXECUTED BY PHE DEPARTMENT NEEDS TO BE COMPLETED ON WAR FOOTING BASIS.
- 3. CHILDREN PARK AND DEVELOPMENT OF ECO TOURISM PARK IS MUST FOR THE WELFARE OF CHILDRENS.
- 4. NTPHC SHOULD BE PROVIDED WITH BASIC EQUIPMENT FACILITIES AND MEDICINES.
- 5. THERE IS URGENT REQUIREMENT OF HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL AS PROJECTED EARLIER ALSO BECAUSE THERE ARE SEVEN PANCHAYAT BEYOND TATAPANI AND IN THEIR VISCINITY ONLY ONE HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL IS THERE AND THAT IS AT KALAKOTE. IT TAKES MORE THAN TWO HOURS FOR CHILDREN FROM FARTHEST PANCHAYAT TO REACH AT KALAKOTE FOR ATTENDING 11TH AND 12TH CLASS.
- 6. MINI J&K BANK BRANCH AT TATAPANI ALONG WITH ATM IS REQUIRED AS IT IS TOURIST PLACE.
