2.	Allotment of plots to 65 families in 1953 was made by Govt. Now all the owners of land in Gigril Village are without title of their land due to which they are not able to get benefit of Sca.
II	Major/ urgent public demands that was/ were reflected earlier but see back side have not been addressed so far: (i) Land issue with army still unresolved (ii) Electricity bills (iii) Water unfit for drinking from hand pumps (iv) Modernisation of irrigation canal (v) Drainage system of Village.

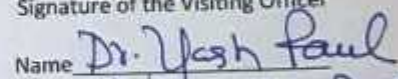
