GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- The visiting officer shall refrain himself/ herself giving or offering any commitment on behalf of the government and shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues. As far as possible, his/her observation should be based on a fair and analytical view emerging from his/her interaction in the village.
- He is going to the village as planning officer, not for sanctioning any works or for making any commitments.
- 3. While preparing village development plan, he has to ensure that, demands are prioritized and reflected under available schemes, wherever necessary the larger works are to be referred to administrative deptt under CSS/UT plans under intimation to DCs and rest of the works to DCs for reflecting it under district/CSS plans
- 4. His work shall be hard core planning and audit and is not a PR exercise.
- 5. Every Deputy Commissioner has to ensure that atleast one RDD official (ideally Panchayat Secretary) is present in every panchayat with relevant panchayat records, to ensure conduct of all activities as planned. Panchayat wise order needs to be issued in advance.
- 6. Visiting officer should ideally carry his/her laptop to complete the reports at the panchayat level itself and upload the final report, duly signed both by the sarpanch and by the visiting officer on www.jkpanchayat.in portal, before they leave panchayat.
- 7. Focus of visit are youth, skills, self-employment, nasha mukt, bhrashtrachar mukt, Rozgar yukt J&K, besides to carry forward the activities during Jan Abhiyan and saturate them.

AGENDA 3: SATURATE JAN BHIYAN DELIVERABLES AND RECORD DEFICIENCIES IF ANY (INSERT DELIVERABLES LIST HERE AS PER GAD FORMAT

- **01.** At the outset interaction with all the front line workers of ICDS, Health, RDD, Sheep Husbandry, Forest, Education, PDD, Horticulture, I&FC, R&B, Agriculture, PHE, Animal Husbandry, J&K Bank, CSC & Avush was made.
- **02.** Officers/officials of different departments made awareness to the people about the individual beneficiary schemes.
- 03. In collaboration with the employees of the CSC/ Khidmat Centre people were made conscious about contemporary online services /(G2C) schemes available and how benefit can be availed by the people through them. Awareness about Janbhagidari, Aap ki Zamin Aap Ki Nigrani, Digital J&K was also made. Further, stress on coverage of 100% population of the area for Ayushman Golden Card, Aadhar Card, e-Sharm card was also laid.
- **04.** Land Passbooks were distributed among many villagers. Baby kits were also distributed among the newly become mothers for care of their babies.
- **05.** A plantation drive was also made and a Deodar sapling was planted with the premises of Jawalapora School. Many saplings were also distributed among the locals.
- **06.** Two playing events were conducted during the day with the school children i.e., Carrom and Volley Ball in the school premises.
- **07.** A visit to Government establishments like Anganwari Centers, FPS & Schools, etc. was also made. Physical inspection of records was also carried out.
- 08. A special session of public hearings was made where grievances of locals were received and discussed. On the demand of local public following filed visits were made day vis-à-vis issues observed:
 - a. A site which is an under construction road being executed under PMGSY from Jawalapora to Udroo via Akhervail was inspected. The road is incomplete since long and people are demanding its early completion as it connects a big bunch of population with Jawalapora.
 - b. Inspection of incomplete Public Health Centre of Jawalapora was made. On enquiry, about its incompletion, it was given to understand that the contractor midway left the job undone and did not turn up. Moreover, there is also a dispute with the land owner for want of compensation.
 - c. A site inspection was also made near the house of Ghulam Mohammad Thokur to the Gaamkoul. Pertinently, it needs immediate attention by way of raising of protection bund as there remains high water flow in the koul during rainy and winter season. At present the water passage is damaged at many places.
 - d. A visit to the road main road leading to Jawalapora near School was made and it was noticed that there is a need to raise a protection wall alongwith stair steps near the house of Ghulam Rasool Malyar.
 - e. An under construction playground was visited and progress of work was also checked.
 - f. A visit to Phanchayat Ghar of Jawalapora was also made. The P. Ghar is not functional as there is a dispute with the land owner for want of compensation/job.
- **09.** A newly opened bank branch of Jammu & Kashmir Bank Limited was visited and discussion was held with the Officers of the bank about the schemes being extended to the villagers.
- 10. Meeting with the senior citizens, government employees and youth was held and a group discussion was also made to bring all sections of society on same grid to bring positive changes in the village.
- 11. Open discussion on Brashtachar Mukht and Nasha Mukt Abhiyan was also held. People were made aware about the menace of corruption and drug abuse and how it affects the society. A positive response was seen at the end of event.
- 12. Gandhi Katha programme was held and people were made aware about the great work done by the National Leader vis-à-vis need to carry forward his mission.

Any major complaint brought to the notice of the Visiting Officer: Yes (details below at A & B) Due to shortage of drinking water in the area, the Government few years back started a project under NABARD viz. "WSS Jawalapora" at an estimated cost of Rs. 3.31 Crores. Till date the work is incomplete. All the locals are aggrieved and demand immediate completion of the project to overcome their water crises. There is a big demand for posting of Veterinary Surgeon in the area as the same is inevitably required. Three schools viz. Girls Primary School, Boys Middle School & (make shift) High School, Shogapora are working under one roof at Jawalapora. There is dearth of space in the school. Therefore, the locals demand extension of School premises plus shifting of High School, Shogapora to some other place. B. Construction of road from Jawalapora to Udroo via Akhervail. Completion of Public Health Centre of Jawalapora. Raising of protection bund on the Gaamkoul. Raising of protection wall on main road along school with stair steps near the house of Ghulam Rasool Malyar. Operationalization of Phanchayat Ghar of Jawalapora. Development of road from Jawalapora to Gojra along with culvert. Construction of road from filtration plant to Bon Mohalla Jawalapora. Completion of filtration Plant in Bikmnar Jawalpora scheme "WSS Bikamnar" Construction of protection Bund on both sides of PMGSY road from Gojra to Dalwan. Construction of bund near the house of Gh.
