General Assessment of The V. C

The general masses believe in the assurances and commitments of the Government. However, it was observed that the Gramen masses are annoyed with the Government in particular and with Line departments in general. The kind of spirit exhibited in previous phases was not seen. Reasons could be multiple, people at large were been aggrieved with Govt. functionaries for not fulfilling their critical demands instead satisfying them with half-work of Rural Dev. Department through PRI members. Again trust deficit between the Government and Gramen masses was sensed.

In order to rebuild the faith and of Gramen masses, the following suggestions are offered for consideration:

- Critical Demands
1. Upgradation of PWD to CCE
 2. Upgradation of M.S. Primary School.
 3. Establishment of Fire and Emergency Station at Shanti Nagar.
 4. Protection wall of River Brahmaputra behind Gramen Union P.D.C. (Village)
 5. Sanction of water Refilling (Kalyanpur) tourism scheme project on flat ground in Kalyanpur.
- (a) Fulfill the prioritized demand of Gramen masses as soon as possible and in case of any technically feasibility issues, the demand may either be dropped or/and an appropriate remedy be chalked out by the concerned department within the knowledge of PWD.
- (b) The line departments may be asked to assign the duty involving such kind of programmes to a portion officer/official, well versed with the demands and capable to convey the grievances of the public with prompt, urgency.
- (c) The documents which pertain to departments, may be displayed outside the offices of concerned depth reflecting the status of the work to be carried out only published in print media instead the programme of 1 to 3 months dependency upon the area, be assigned to one V
