GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. The visiting officer shall refrain himself/ herself giving or offering any commitment on behalf of the government and shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues. As far as possible, his/her observation should be based on a fair and analytical view emerging from his/her interaction in the village.
- 2. He is going to the village as planning officer, not for sanctioning any works or for making any commitments.
- 3. While preparing village development plan, he has to ensure that, demands are prioritized and reflected under available schemes, wherever necessary the larger works are to be referred to administrative deptt under CSS/UT plans under intimation to DCs and rest of the works to DCs for reflecting it under district/CSS plans
- 4. His work shall be hard core planning and audit and is not a PR exercise.
- 5. Every Deputy Commissioner has to ensure that atleast one RDD official (ideally Panchayat Secretary) is present in every panchayat with relevant panchayat records, to ensure conduct of all activities as planned. Panchayat wise order needs to be issued in advance.
- 6. Visiting officer should ideally carry his/her laptop to complete the reports at the panchayat level itself and upload the final report, duly signed both by the sarpanch and by the visiting officer on www.jkpanchayat.in portal, before they leave panchayat.
- 7. Focus of visit are youth, skills, self-employment, nasha mukt, bhrashtrachar mukt, Rozgar yukt J&K, besides to carry forward the activities during Jan Abhiyan and saturate them.

APPENDIX "B".

Subject: Overall assessment of the visit and suggestions

Overall assessment of the visit:

Back to village program is a landmark step towards overall development of rural areas. The panchayat halqa (VEHIL), which was assigned to me, is on the right path of development. Many pavements have been laid with tiles; some of the roads to other village have been macadamized. The shortage of drinking water facility may end soon as I was told by BDO that work on **Ramnagri-Benniipora-vehil water supply scheme (hereafter RBVWS)** has been started, however sanction of community level Bore wells with submerged pumps may ease the problem till the completion of RBVWS. Electricity distribution infrastructure should be augmented, as at many places the LT lines were seen tied with trees stems and branches. So many applications received from villagers and on spot inspection of nallah **Vadji** revealed that absence of flood protection bund is posing a huge threat to the property and lives of inhabitants. Ever since the start of first phase of B2V program the inhabitants of the Pyt. Halqa have demanded the up gradation of the PHC. During the visit it was seen the PHC faces shortage of staff especially, Gynecologist, dental surgeon, X-Ray technician etc. However the inhabitants/ patients were satisfied with the services provided by the existing staff. While interacting with the staff posted there it was observed that the center is facing huge shortage of water, which was on spot sorted by the BDO by sanctioning of a bore well for the center.

Disposal of the solid waste is a serious problem which the inhabitants of the Pyt. Halqa are facing. Many canals and streams were seen being used as garbage dumping sites due which huge silt has got accumulated in them. Although the Block development agency has the provision of providing garbage dumping pits at community level but one question remains that; what will be done when filled completely? Who will clear them? The issue of the garbage dumping in water bodies was discussed with the village Auquaf head and others and they were requested to educate people about its bad effects, for this they can use the services of youth clubs as well. Encouraging people to dispose of the garbage at individual level without polluting any water body or public place is the need of hour. In addition it is suggested that the village be provided with a garbage van and large dustbins so that the garbage is dumped outside the habitation at an appropriate place.

Another thing that was observed during the visit is that the Pyt. Halqa has adopted the clean energy model to a little extent, for this some solar lights have been installed at public places and as such it is suggested that solar lights be installed on all major and minor roads including the internal streets. Providing solar lighting system to IHHs will be a great step.

Lastly I would like to put my observations on *Har Gaon haryali*. I observed that only a little has been done in this field. The Pyt Halqa has one success story in this field, which was observed during the visit to Shrine of the Sufi Saint^(r.a.). The lawn of the shrine contains few recently planted trees like *Cryptomeria*, *Cedrus* etc which have a soothing effect on one's soul. I would like to suggest that similar purposeful (not just for formality) plantation drives be carried out at all appropriate places involving all stakeholders especially youth. Evergreen tree species like *Pinus*, *Abies*, *Cedrus*, *Cryptomeria* etc should be given preference. Only then the Pyt. Halqa will achieve the delopmental goals in real sense.
